

Tales from the Police Blotter

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Wednesday, July 1

*Following an incident on Dogwood Lane, where it was reported that a resident was struck with a bottle and shots fired, Paul Clayborne Guthrie, 21, was cited on a charge of second-degree assault and resisting arrest. Guthrie also was cited on two charges of third-degree assault, one charge of fourth-degree assault, second-degree theft and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle.

*A man who reported to clinic staff that he had a head injury, and that he was Jesus Christ, was transported from Siskiyou Community Health Center by American Medical Response to Three Rivers Community Hospital (TRCH) in Grants Pass.

*A driver stated that she was distracted after striking a butterfly with her vehicle, which is why she ran a “Stop” sign on Crooks Creek Road and ended up in a ditch around 11 a.m.

*A white Dodge pickup truck was reported stolen from a Laurel Road location.
