Caulie ‘Tex’ Carrigan
Caulie “Tex” Carrigan, 91, of Cave Junction, a founder of Illinois Valley Senior Center, died quietly and peacefully on Wednesday, Aug. 12, 2009, at his home with friends and family surrounding him with love.

A Celebration of Life will be held at Bridgeview Community Church in Cave Junction on Saturday, Aug. 22 at 11 a.m. with a potluck to follow. A private service will have been held at the gravesite for the family earlier.

“Tex” was born on July 18, 1918 in Thrall, Texas to Willie & Mamie Carrigan as an only child. He spent most of his childhood in Prairie Lea, Texas, where he graduated high school. He went on to college, but did not complete higher education, as World War II started, and he proudly joined the U.S. Marine Corps. He served a number of years in Southern California and then went to Pearl Harbor after the Dec. 7, 1941 attack by the Japanese Navy. He was extremely proud of his service to

the USA and being a Marine. He married and had a daughter, Cindy, who survives.

Upon returning to the States, he spent his life in many endeavors including working on oil rigs; being self-employed as a salesman; and owning a restaurant. Prior to retiring he owned and ran an RV sales-and-service operation in Southern California.

After a divorce, in 1963 he met and married Elaine Gosser and acquired three teen-agers who survive as adults. Together Tex & Elaine spent a lot of time in their RV, operating their business, running a mobile home park and going to church. In 1978, they moved to Cave Junction, Ore. to begin a new adventure. For 22 years prior to Elaine’s death in January 2000 they enjoyed living in the woods, growing his garden and his being a lay preacher.

Tex loved being a “forever salesman” and being in front of any church congregation. It was often said that he could not go anywhere without knowing everyone and speaking with everyone even if he did not know them.

Tex & Elaine founded what is now the thriving Illinois Valley Senior Center. They had an idea that Illinois Valley needed one, and with the help of many others it became a reality. He was also a lifetime member of the Masonic Lodge.

Surviving is his daughter Cindy Dew, of Bakersfield, Calif.; two sons, Rusty Gosser and Denny Gosser; and daughter, Debra Buchanan, all of Cave Junction; and many grandchildren, great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren.

Pay Attention to Taxes if You Move

Millions of people move each year, often during the summer months when children are out of school. If you’re making a move this summer, be aware that moving can have some important tax consequences.

Retirement plans. If you have a retirement plan at work, you may have several choices upon leaving a job. You can roll your retirement funds into an IRA, possibly roll the money into a new employer’s plan, or perhaps even leave the money in your former employer’s plan. Keep in mind that any amount distributed directly to you is subject to automatic 20% income tax withholding, and you may also face a 10% early withdrawal penalty.

401(k) loans. Facing a layoff or new job and need cash? Tap your 401(k) account only as a last resort. If you have an existing 401(k) loan, pay it off. If you leave your employer and can’t repay the loan within a preset time, the loan balance is considered a withdrawal. As such, you’ll be hit with income taxes and possibly a 10% penalty.

Job search expenses. Expenses incurred to search for a new job are tax-deductible, even if your job search doesn’t land you that coveted position. To qualify, you must be looking for a job in your current occupation.

Moving expenses. If your job-related move qualifies (the IRS has both a distance and a time test), you can deduct the costs of moving your household goods and your family.

Home sale. When you sell your home, you can exclude up to \$250,000 of the gain from your taxes. The exclusion amount is \$500,000 for married couples filing a joint return. To qualify for the full exclusion, you must have owned and occupied the house as your main home for two out of the five years prior to its sale. A partial exclusion may apply if you fail the two-year test due to a job-related move.

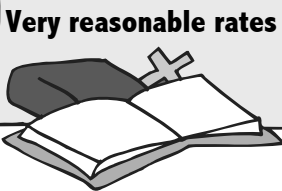
