Two nights of Tango offered at Chateau

Romantic evenings of Argentinian Tango are offered at the Oregon Caves Chateau on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 9 and 10: Participants can choose either or both nights.

The lessons are free to Chateau guests or those who have dinner at the Chateau. The complimentary tango lessons will run from 8 to 10 p.m., and the public can take advantage of reduced room rates for autumn for overnight accommodations.

Instructor Graeme Clark began studying the dance 10 years ago at the University of Oregon at Eugene. He later became involved with the Eugene tango community and volunteered as a teaching aide in tango classes at U of O.

Graeme has gone on to study with several well-known teachers including Luciana Valle, Daniel Trenner, Cristopher Nassopoulos and Caroline Pettie, Carlos Riverola and Alex Krebs.

Through this pursuit, Graeme met his teaching and dance partner, Jimena Avila. She has studied tango in Portland and Mexico, and taken group and private lessons

with Valle.

The couple moved to her hometown of Santiago de Queretaro, the capital of the state of Queretaro, Mexico. This prosperous city of more than half a million was named one of the top 15 historic destinations of the world by *National Geographic* in 2008. Its ancient center is considered a World Heritage Site.

While living in Queretaro, Graeme and Jimena helped establish a tango community and began teaching together in 2003. During a three-year period, they taught beginner, intermediate, and advanced tango classes, and helped host special tango events with visiting teachers. Through the city's cultural center, they helped develop social dance groups which continue there and at several other sites in Queretaro.

The couple moved recently to Southern Oregon, and now devote all their available time to duplicating the success they achieved in Mexico. The two-hour classes they will teach Friday and Saturday nights will include the basics of the tango walk; "ochos turns," "walking to the

cross," and various "adornments," which are more elaborate moves to enhance the experience.

'Evening of Art & Wine' returns to Kerby

Merchants of historic Kerbyville are putting out a "Welcome" mat to explore the fall bounty of arts during the third 2009 Evening of Art & Wine on Friday, Oct. 9 from 5 to 8 p.m.

Visitors coming from the north may want to start the tour on the west side of Hwy. 199 (Redwood Hwy.) at the north end of Kerby, where Karen & Michael Yanase of Yanase Jewelers will display his new custom-designed pieces. October's gemstones, tourmaline and opal, will be featured, plus tasty snacks.

Farther south, at their showroom in an historic Kerby building, Delbert & Helen Kauffman of Kauffmann Wood Products will display their fine log pole furniture and home décor. Valley musician Jim Rich will play Baroque music on harpsichord and oboe. And the Kauffmans will pour a variety of offerings from Bridgeview Vineyards & Winery.

At Kerbyville Museum, a short distance farther south on the east side of Redwood Hwy., members of the Sourdough Chapter of Back Country Horsemen will be in the barn and blacksmith shop, presenting a "living history program," telling stories and portraying several historical personalities. In the event of rain, visitors can find them in the historic, fully furnished Stith-Naucke House.

Kerbyville Museum will have raffle tickets for a doll house model of the historic house. Raffle proceeds will go toward matching grant money for the badly needed restoration of the original late 1880s house.

Visitors coming from the south may want to start the evening at the Southern Oregon Guild (SOG) Gallery & Artists' Center in RCC's new Business Entrepreneurial Center at the Kerby Belt Bldg., 24353 Redwood Hwy.

At the SOG Gallery, visitors can obtain raffle tickets for a selection of art works, enjoy new exhibits, taste Windridge Vineyard wines and sample the hors

d'oeuvres buffet.

Guild members, George & Anwyn Leverett, of O'Brien, who are Renaissance musicians and instrument makers, will perform at the Gallery that evening. This well-known duo will play their unique fusion of medieval and Celtic-style music.

Across the street at Hampton's Rock Shop on the south end of the tour, Gabrielle & Fred Hampton invite visitors to view the weightiest pieces of the evening: two 4-foot-tall, 350-pound onyx vases, as well as handmade sterling silver jewelry and handmade stone beads.

The Hamptons also will serve wine from Bridgeview

Vineyards, and fresh zucchini bread.

Two doors north of Hampton's (next to Kerby Mart) is the Heikka Foundry, a new location for the Evening of Art & Wine in Kerby. Look carefully for this treasure, as there is no sign yet.

Heikka Foundry is a lost wax, art foundry started by E.E. Heikka, the renowned Western art sculptor whose work is in museums across the country. Mike Heikka, who works with his father, is the third generation to carry on the tradition. The Heikkas offer a foundry tour, and viewing their bronze sculpture display. A list of services also will be available.

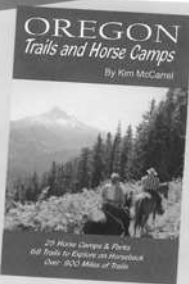
