Tickets available for Symphony show

A limited number of free tickets are available for Josephine County students to attend a Rogue Valley Symphony performance.

There are 140 vouchers for Josephine County students to attend the concert at 3 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 8 at the Grants Pass High School Performing Arts Center, 830 N.E. Ninth St. Tickets are subject to availability and are distributed on a first-come, first-served basis.

The concert will feature Mozart's *Symphony No. 20 in D, K. 133*, Heitor Villa-Lobos' *Fantasia for Soprano Saxophone* with guest saxophonist Rhett Bender, Ricardo Lorenz's *Pataruco: Concerto for Venezuelan Maracas and Orchestra* with guest percussionist Terry Longshore, and Beethoven's *Symphony No 7 in A Major, Op. 92* all under guest conductor Dr. Martin Majkut.

Vouchers for free tickets are distributed to area schools and music teachers, and may also be obtained from www.rvsymphony.org. Connecting with the Classics vouchers are available from the Education Programs link on the Website.
