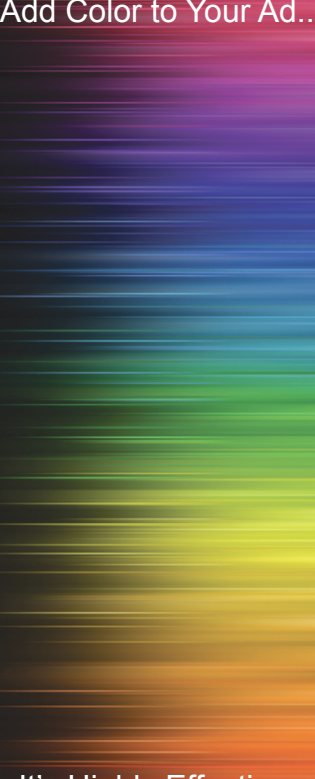

Chamber accepting nominations for citizen, business of the year
