## Thursday, Feb. 3

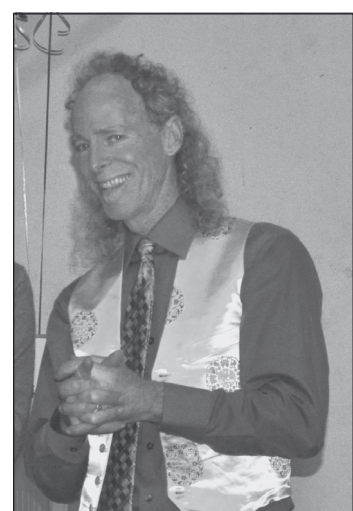
