

Tales from the Police Blotter

Friday, March 4

* Eventhoughthewomancalling from Kerby High Pines Trailer Park claimed that she had a fat lip from a man hitting her, the deputy did not see any marks on her face that would indicate that she had been punched or slapped. The deputy was unable to locate the suspect because the highly uncooperative woman hung up on the dispatcher and slammed the door on the deputy.

* Selmac Auto Service reported that someone paid them with an \$89, non-sufficient funds check.

* There was no evidence of a crime, but a woman reported that a white pickup struck her while she was riding her power chair on Caves Hwy. at S. Junction Ave., while the truck driver claims he did not see her.

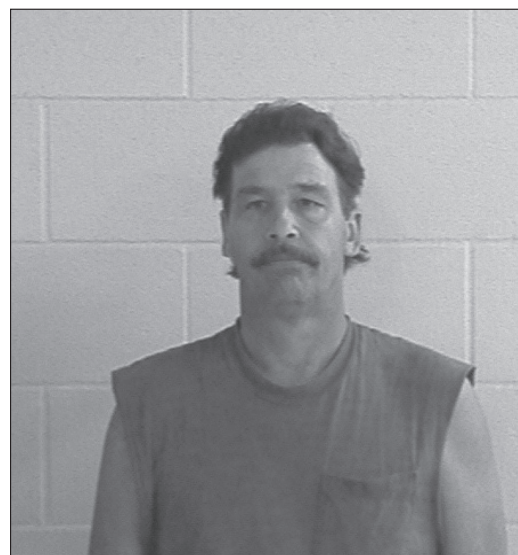
