

Police Memorial Week May 15 to 21st

In a news release from the Josephine County Sheriff's Office, a ceremony will recognize fallen officers at 10 a.m. Monday, May 16 at Newman United Methodist Church on 6th Street between A and B streets in Grants Pass.

This year, May 15 through the 21st was declared Police Memorial Week, honoring law enforcement agencies throughout the county.

On May 16, the public is invited to join community law enforcement agencies to salute the memory of fallen personnel and their sacrifices.

The news release says the ceremony will bring together law enforcement officers from the Sheriff's Office, the Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety, Oregon State Police, U.S. Forest Service and the Oregon Bureau of Land Management.

RCC faculty have judged the competition since 1988, preparing an intensive written exam for each category before the public presentations.

In music, the written exam and the public performance each make up 50 percent of the total score. In other categories, the public presentation ranges from 25 percent in science and math to 40 percent in social studies.

Three Rivers School District superintendent Dan Huber-Kantola, along with Burt Eikleberry, introduced Academic Masters participants and presented the final awards, commending the hard work and preparation of all students who competed.

The ceremony also honored the many individual and business donors who have contributed, either this year or in years past, to keep Academic Masters going.

April 30 is likely the last work day of the landscaping effort. McBride said the project began about a year ago as a way to develop a visually appealing landscape requiring minimal upkeep and resources.
