FTA Warrants Issued 05/02/11 through 05/08/11

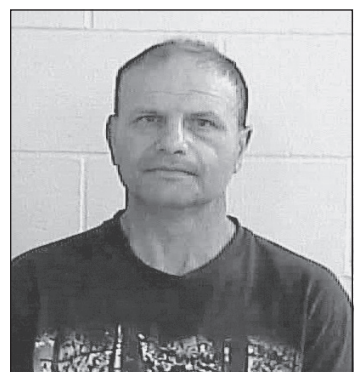

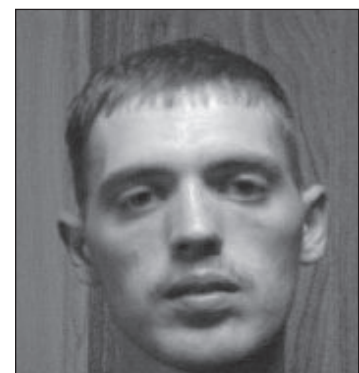
