The Grants Pass Resource Area of the Medford District BLM is proposing 401 acres of variable density thinning, 41 acres of variable retention harvest, 362 acres of density management/hazardous fuel reduction, and 462 acres of hazardous fuel reduction for the proposed East West Junction Project. A previous scoping letter for this project was released for public review on December 5, 2008. The East West Junction Project is being revised to focus on dry forest restoration management which retains legacy trees, oaks, and hardwoods while producing wood for mills and reducing wildfire danger.

The East West Junction Project Planning Area is east and south of the town of Cave Junction on federally managed land. The legal description of the PA is T39S-R7W-Sections 7-11, 15-21, 29, 30; T39S-R8W-Sections 12-14, 19-35; T39S-R9W-Sections 25, 35, 36; T40S-R8W-Sections 2-11, 14-18, 20-23, 26-28; and T40S-R9W-Sections 1-4, 9-16, 21-23 in Josephine County, Willamette Meridian.

Baseball, softball honor seniors, face Rogue River

Before the final home games of the season, Illinois Valley High School softball and baseball teams recognized the contributions of their seniors.
On Saturday, May 14, Cougar seniors on both teams celebrated just before their scheduled double-headers against Rogue River.
Anthony Becker, Curtis Paulson, Zach Anderson and Bryan Biggs were the four seniors honored on the baseball team. For softball, Cindy Moore, Sabrina

Van Tassel and Kayla Johnson received honors, though Johnson was at a track meet Saturday.
Illinois Valley teams had mixed results against Rogue River following senior day: after a big win Tuesday, May 10, the Lady Cougars faltered against the Chieftains, losing the first 0-17 and the second 4-14.
After the losses, Illinois Valley fastpitch was set to play their final regular-season game Tuesday, May 17 at Lakeview. So far, the Lady Cougars have a split record against Lakeview, with one

loss and one win.
The IVHS baseball team swept Rogue River in both games, winning the first 9-5 and edging them in the second 8-7.
After a decisive victory in the first game, Rogue River came back hard in the fifth inning of the second, tying it 7-7. But the Cougars answered with another run, enough for the win. They’re set to play Lakeview Tuesday, May 17 to wrap up regular-season play, and still have a chance to make it to State depending on playoff results.

IVHS Track wraps up season

In a heartbreaker, Yarbrough said the girls’ 4x100-meter relay qualified for District finals Thursday, May 12, but on Saturday dropped the baton, taking them out. Nevertheless, Thursday was their best showing of the season.
According to Yarbrough, many Cougars plan to return

next season, and he expects a strong group of eighth-graders to join as freshman.
“All our younger athletes had good meets and we expect good things,” Yarbrough said. “It’s nothing to hang our heads about not going to State...I expect our team will be even stronger next year than it was this year.”

Coming into a Saturday, May 14, double-header against Rogue River, the leading team in the league, Pope said she stressed the importance of what the Cougars needed to do as a team, rather than Rogue River’s placement or advantages on the field.
“Rogue River is an aggressive team,” Pope said. “They’re very well coached; he’s been coaching there for a long time. I think [Illinois Valley] can stay in any game as long as our heads are in it.”
After Saturday’s double-header, the Lady Cougars had their final game of the season vs. Lakeview Tuesday, May 17.
