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The Illinois Valley High School track and field team took to Glide on Saturday, April 13, to compete in the Maynard Mai/Glide invite where they competed against 20 opposing teams. "We were missing quite a few athletes," said head coach Ray Yarborough. "Our best shot putter, Matt Brock, was out with a knee injury and a couple other kids were sick."

The varsity boys' team placed thirteenth overall with a total

of 30 points and the varsity girls' team took seventh with 74 points. The first-place team on the boys' side was Cascade Christian with 246 points and girls' team took first as well with 182 points.
The teams from IVHS only had one athlete earn first place, and that honor went to Theresa Frederick in the high jump who went 4'10".
Earning second place in the pole vault for the boys was Joshua Allen who cleared 11' even. In the girls' 200 meters, Halona Jackson earned second place as well with a time of 28.61.
Mack Epple was able to place third in the high jump going 5'10" and placing third for the girls in the 400 meters was Jack-

son with a time of 1:04.63.
Frederick also placed fourth in the pole vault by clearing 7' and sixth in 300-meter hurdles with a time of 52.05.
"This certainly wasn't our best meet," Yarborough said. "But it was definitely a valuable experience for the athletes as they got to compete against some quality teams."
This Saturday, April 20, the Cougars attend the Crater Rotary Track and Field Classic at Crater High School in Central Point. Admission will be \$5 for adults, \$3 for students and children under 5 get in for free.
