

I.V. Safehouse on the move

The Illinois Valley Safe House Alliance (IVSHA) will lease their office space, located next to the Oregon DMV, to the U.S. Post Office during the time it will take to complete rebuilding the burned facility. IVSHA is moving their offices to the Illinois Valley Family Coalition at 525 E. River Street for the duration of that lease.

IVSHA Executive Director Chris Mallette states,

“This is a win-win for the Alliance, the US Postal Service and very importantly, the Illinois Valley. For the Alliance, we will have an opportunity to rebuild the

reserves we have used to keep our advocacy services available since we lost our Rural Program funding in October of 2012. For the Postal Service, they will have an adequate facility to return to their normal operating levels; and for our community, we will all have a convenient location to access the Post Office.”

In late September IVSHA received word of a three-year award from the Office on Violence against Women. Mallette explains,

“We were ready to hire back everyone we had laid off, but the gov-

ernment shutdown put those plans on hold. The community continues to offer us strong support. Besides the many individuals who give annually and monthly, local support in the last quarter has included the Carpenter Foundation, Sterling Bank and the Rogue Valley Classic Chevy Car Club.”

The Alliance will be closing October 18th through October 25th to accomplish the move and settle in. Starting Monday, October 28, 2013, services will be available at the new location Monday through Thursday, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Fridays from

9 a.m. to noon.

Following installation of post boxes, new flooring, and other necessary renovations, postal services in the temporary facility at 103 S. Kerby Avenue are scheduled to begin mid-November.

Non-emergency complaint? Report to JCSO on-line

Reports of non-emergency crimes are being accepted on-line or by going to a substation in Cave Junction* or Merlin “to receive assistance through our Volunteer Assistance Program,” reported the Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO).

Said JCSO:

“From the convenience of your home computer Internet browser simply type: jocosherriff.us which takes you to our home page. In the right column you will find a box reading: On-Line Crime Reporting. Click on this box and follow instructions to complete the form.

“A reference number will automatically be assigned. Please review your report for accuracy (details are critical and required – i.e., make, model, serial numbers, photos, etc.), and then click Submit. A box will appear giving you an option to print your report. Insurance companies require a police report for your claim to be

processed.

“We apologize for any inconvenience. At this time, circumstances mandate prioritization protocols when responding to calls for service. We fully realize that all crimes are important to a victim. The crime/information will be entered into our computerized system for future reference; and in some cases, a possible follow-up investigation.”

JCSO added that it is recruiting for additional volunteers. Applications can be found at the county website www.co.josephine.or.us and should be submitted to the Josephine County Human Resources Dept.
