Answers:

- 1. C: Birds are the only animals with feathers. Since some birds like emus and ostriches can't fly, this isn't a distinctive trait to the species.
- 2. B: There are over 9,000 species of birds in the world. Over 400 live in the U.S.A.
- 3. A: The sternum or breastbone has a flat outer surface, called the keel. It provides a large area for the attachment of the wing muscles.
- 4. C: With perching birds, the toes remain curled and pulled together as long as the legs are bent, allowing

these birds to perch for hours at a time. Wading birds have webbed or lobed feet.

- 5. C: Birds have four chambered hearts, which are larger and more muscular than that of a mammal of comparable size. They also have higher body temperatures than most mammals, ranging from 102 to 110 degrees.
- 6. C: Most birds have poor senses of smell and taste.
- 7. B: All birds have two types of "Stomachs", a glandular stomach and a muscular stomach.
- 8. C: Hovering flight is used to remain motionless over one spot and requires more energy than flapping flight. Only a few species, such as hummingbirds and hawks are capable of hovering flight.
- 9. A: Although puffins look a lot like penguins, the

big difference is that puffins can fly.

- 10. B: In most species, songs are triggered by the release of sex hormones and are sung only by the males during spring.

Well, how did you do? I have to say, I was stumped on a few. My score was a roaring 7 out of 10.

Randy Frazee has written a book called "The Connecting Church." He has a son who was born without a left hand. One day in Sunday School the teacher was talking with the children about the church. To illustrate her point she folded her hands together and said, "Here's the church, here's the steeple; open the doors and see all the people."

She asked the class to do it along with her, obviously not thinking about his son's inability to pull this exercise off. Then it dawned on her that the boy wouldn't be able to join in.

Before she could do anything about it, the little boy next to his son, a friend of his from the time they were babies, reached

out his left hand and said, "Let's do it together." The two boys proceeded to join their hands together to make the church and the steeple.

Frazee, remembering this incident, says, "This little hand exercise should never be done again by a lone individual because the church is not a collection of individuals, but the one body of Christ."

The church, the body of Christ is all the saints who have lived, who are living now and who will live in the future. The church is one person helping another person.

Being in community with another, being a witness, being a saint for another saint is what the body of Christ, the church, is

all about. Being able to be and walk with another down their path without wanting to direct or lead that person is our calling in the body of Christ. Being able to share with another their burdens without making it your own, being able to comfort another with our witness of action as well as the word is what the priesthood of saints is all about. Now is the time for each of us to turn to our brother and sister in Christ to give them strength, courage, comfort and confidence as they walk their journey of faith.

We can turn to the saint next to us and say, as the little boy did, "Let's do it together".
