

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor’s Note: Factual information for ‘Blotter’ is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Dec. 2

*Approximately \$5,000 worth of tools were burglarized from a construction trailer in the 25000 block of Redwood Hwy. during the weekend, according to a complaint. A trail of tools was followed to a house near the Sis-kiyou Community Health Center. Some of the items were found in nearby woods.

*Persons involved in a noninjury motor vehicle accident on the Cave Junction City Hall parking lot around 10 a.m. exchanged information.

*Close to noon at Jubilee Park a woman said that a man in an older, very low-slung, black sports car spun brodies on a parking lot there, and then took off east on Caves Hwy. A deputy toured the area, but the skilled motorist was not located.

*An unidentified driver was cited on a charge of failure to obey a traffic control device in Downtown CJ.

*An abandoned vehicle was towed from Schumacher Street in CJ.

*Because she overdosed on nonprescription pain pills at her place on Caves Avenue, a woman was taken to Three Rivers Community Hospital in Grants Pass under a peace officer’s mental hold, particularly because on the way she fought with medics of American Medical Response, and law enforcement aid was needed.

*Around 2:13 p.m. a deputy responded Code 3 (lights and siren/emergency) after a pregnant woman living in a travel trailer in the 24000 block of Redwood Hwy. reported a disturbance in which two men were forcing her from the residence. It turned out to be a civil matter, and she was advised of options.

*There were approximately 20 other log items, all from the rural Grants Pass area. One of the incidents was a report that a man’s household belongings including furniture and appliances were removed by a creep in a pickup truck.

Tuesday, Dec. 3

*A hit-and-run crash on a Downtown CJ parking lot was reported. (The official term for such irresponsible actions is termed “failure to leave name at the scene of an accident).

*After leaving her car on a private driveway the day before, a woman returned to N. Sawyer Avenue today, near the city water treatment plant, only to find that her vehicle had been stolen.

*Some dude was trying to sell firewood on a lot near the Junction Inn, and was reported for not having a city business license. He

took his wood and beat it.

*Subsequent to a 911 hang-up call from Kerby Street, a woman said that there was no problem and that the call-taker heard her cussing because one of her arms hurt. That was found to be the truth.

*There were 16 log items from the rural GP area today, including one about a strange man threatening customers in a store and acting weird.

Wednesday, Dec. 4

*Someone reported an elderly man from Rogue River with a frozen face lying on the roadway in the 8000 block of Upper Deer Creek Road in Selma. Emergency personnel, including those from the Illinois Valley Fire Protection District, responded to help the man, whose car was somewhere in the woods.

*While walking to the O’Brien Country Store, a man’s wife said he was assaulted by a man with a cane and who then pulled a gun. The suspect is a military veteran said to be unstable.

*On Lister Way a deputy stood by while someone used their allocated 20 minutes to move out from a residence.

*Following a traffic stop in the 28000 block of Redwood Hwy., Mark George Miller, 46, was charged with manufacturing and possessing meth and marijuana, and under a probation violation detainer. He went to the Josephine County Jail in GP. His vehicle was

impounded. With Miller was Clyde MacDonald, 19, who was cited into Curry County Circuit Court under some warrant or other.

*Rural GP calls today totaled 17, with the most interesting being one in which a woman accused a GP cab driver of taking more than 100 Vicodin tablets from her, and she accused Sheriff Gil Gilbertson of trying to break into her home.

Thursday, Dec. 5

*Out of the 15 log items for today, none were from the Valley. Those from the GP rural locale included several involving theft of mail from mailboxes, and the reported theft of a riding mower valued at \$2,350.

Friday, Dec. 6

*Described as threatening, it was noted that the small, lifted, black pickup truck in which adult men, one with a beard, were driving (they took turns later in Downtown CJ), was driven aggressively in Jubilee Park.

*People were concerned about a couple living on Öllis Road because they hadn’t been seen for a while, and they hadn’t paid their rent. They were located and found OK.

*The previous two incidents were it for today in the Valley, but there were 19 calls in rural GP, several involving motor vehicle crashes and spin-outs, apparently due to inclement weather.
