

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor's Note: Factual information for 'Blotter' is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Feb. 17

*When a man in the 37000 block of Redwood Hwy. "found meth pipes at his house ... with two kids present" he said that he confronted his wife and they argued; he suffered a scratch on his neck. "She ripped the phone out of the wall while (he) was calling 911." He feels that "his wife has relapsed into drug use and (he) is concerned for the safety of his children."
*In the 2500 block of Rockydale Road a resident phoned at 10:30 a.m. to say he "believes that his neighbor has poisoned his dog" and that he "may have been poisoning him. He has been very ill for two months with strange symptoms." As the neighbor "is continually threatening to kill the complainant," the latter asked for and was provided ad-

vice regarding a stalking order. The complainant phoned again at 1:52 p.m. with the same information.
*The mother of a young, continually running-away-from-home boy on Pine Cone Drive stated that he had returned "and is quite sick so he might be home for a while hopefully."
*A resident in the 3200 block of Deer Creek Road reported that someone broke into his house and took items including a gun.
*From Finch Road came a call that "someone cut the line to our propane tank and stole the tank. (It) was about 80 percent full."
*Burglary on Aquarius Way was reported.
*Theft of equipment was reported in the 500 block of Caves Hwy. Later, tools were found in the complainant's garage. It was noted that on Jan. 31 the same person reported burglary at the location.
*Theft of power on Lone Mountain Road was reported by Pacific Power, and a request was made that a deputy stand by while equipment was removed.

Outside the Valley:

*Wow: 20 calls. They included one from the Rural/Metro Fire Dept. station near Wilderville Road that a man with "wide eyes" stole a bag of stuff from a firefighter's car. Most of the items were recovered, and not long afterward the unidentified suspect was held at gunpoint by a deputy. Charges were unauthorized entry to a motor vehicle and second-degree theft. A charge of possession of a controlled substance/meth was referred to the district attorney's office.
*Several other residential burglaries also were reported, plus theft of a golf cart; and an incident in which a man was told to stick a sign up his rear after he put it up in front of his house stating that his neighbors are "punks."

Tuesday, Feb. 18

*A restraining order was served in the 5000 block of Deer Creek Road.
*Theft of undisclosed items was reported in the 700 block of

Caves Hwy.

*The loss of \$2,000 from her savings account was noted by a resident in the 8000 block of Caves Hwy., who stated that someone forged her signature and cashed one of her checks at a bank in Coos Bay.

Outside the Valley:

*There were 17 calls about varied situations. One was from a woman "who stated that she was being telepathically stalked by the Mafia and that they wanted to kill her son and daughter." Several others were from residents reporting break-ins and burglaries at their homes while they were away.

Thursday, Feb. 20

*There was an intruder alarm in the 1000 block of Caves Hwy. at 10:16 a.m. The call was listed by the sheriff's office as "beyond available resources."
*Trespassing at a vacant home on Jonathan Court was complained about at 1:09 p.m. No one was found in the home, which is to be occupied

soon by its new owner.

Outside the Valley:

*Would you believe 16 calls? Harassment, a disturbance, and a report that an unsupervised young boy destroyed a neighbor's shed were included.

Friday, Feb. 21

*An OSP trooper was backed up by a deputy at Forks State Park, as the trooper had a wanted man in custody. He was taken to county jail.
*Some 83 pain pills were stolen from a man's car on Caves Avenue, he said. He didn't secure them, he said, because his car locks don't work.
