

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor’s Note: Factual information for ‘Blotter’ is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, March 31

*In the 8000 block of Takilma Road a resident said that a loose mare with a long blue rope had been on the road for approximately 90 minutes. A neighbor was going to watch the steed in her yard, and was seeking someone with horses to care for it.

*In the 10000 block of Takilma Road a man was worried about a woman. She had been threatened by another man, and there was a recent physical confrontation, said the complainant. He had been unable to reach her all weekend. He did eventually, and found her to be OK.

*For patrol information, deputies were advised that around 10 p.m. in the 6000 block of Westside Road four gunshots were heard, followed by flashlights in the yard (apparently held by people) and yelling (also by people). And several cars were being driven to and from the residence at high speed. (Wow, stop the presses!)

*A man was screaming and yelling in the 400 block of E. River Street shortly before noon. He was said to be banging and pounding on walls and floors with a further note that he “drinks a lot and takes drugs” and is “very strong.” A deputy contacted him, and found him to not be a danger to himself or others.

*For some reason there was interest in a small car being driven through Kerby toward metropolitan Cave Junction.

*Eleven calls were received.

Tuesday, April 1

*Oddly, no April Fool jokes were report-

ed.

*People in the 23000 block of Redwood Hwy. were said to be having a landlord/tenant dispute in connection with eviction. Parties were advised to not be confrontational, and the evictees were told they had until Friday to get their stuff, but only during daylight.

*In the 17000 block of Redwood Hwy. a deputy was out with an RV.

*From Browntown Road came a call from a man who believes that he knows who stole his car last week. He has no proof, but feels that the suspected thief “is associated with many car thefts in the area.” The complainant “made vague threats that if (the thieving punk) is not dealt with that he will deal with him himself. He stated that there may not be many beds in the jail, but there is “lots of room in the forest.” He was advised that his threats were documented.

*Violation of a restraining order was reported by a woman at a Cave Junction business, as the restrainee contacted some of her friends outside the business.. She added that he showed a gun and that he stalks her and always knows where she is.

*There was a 911 hang-up call from Downtown CJ, but a problem was not located. Nor was the caller identified.

*Four persons in a pickup truck were seen in connection with several vacant buildings being entered and ransacked in the 6000 block of Rockydale Road.

*There were 15 calls logged, none involving death nor injury. There were some family feuds; stolen items were found in Merlin, and a woman said that her son’s mother broke into her home and stole a computer and medical marijuana. She then texted the victim to advise that she did it to prevent her ex-husband from conducting a home invasion and committing murder.

Thursday, April 3

*At Forks State Park a man reported seeing a relative’s stolen van. In the vehicle he saw a woman “who looked like a tweaker.” A four-door car with four men inside was believed to “be associated” with the van. The complainant felt threatened and left. Later, one of the vehicles was on Walters Drive, and someone was warned about being towed.

*Possible unauthorized withdrawals from a dead man’s account at a CJ bank were noted by a person who shares the account, but who thought that she had been removed as a co-signer.

*At 2:14 p.m. the driver of a car smacked it into the Junction Inn. A report was pending on a noninjury crash with property damage. The driver, whose name was not made public by the Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO), was cited on charges of careless driving and driving uninsured.

*Twelve incidents were logged. One was about narcotics being stolen from a car. (While parked it is assumed.)

Troopers in the Valley Friday, April 4

*A report was taken from a Selma resident claiming that his gun was taken during burglary of his house.

*Brandi Bergeron, 40, was arrested after four stolen vehicles were found at the property she was using in the 6000 block of Rockydale Road.

Saturday, April 5

*There was a complaint from Shadowbrook Drive that a resident’s van was stolen at 2 a.m. The rear bumper under the window has a red sticker that reads, “My Other Auto is a 9mm.” (Apparently the bumper sticker wasn’t

enough to deter the thief).

*Burglary was reported on Chapman Creek Road.

*A two-vehicle crash with possible injuries was reported at 1:02 p.m. at S. Redwood Hwy. and Lister Street. No deputies were in the area so OSP responded. Drivers were identified as Andrew M. Blasy, 30, and Kimberly Webbe, 49. It appears that Blasy was cited on charge of failing to obey a traffic control device.

*OSP responded to a report of a stolen van whose driver rolled it at a CJ location as it was being chased by the owner. After the crash the driver was in a field, and a woman was inside the van. Other details were unavailable in time for this issue.

Outside the Valley

*Eight calls were received. They included Gerald Peed, 51, being arrested and taken to county jail in Grants Pass on a charge of first-degree assault after his roommate on Pleasant Valley Road reported being stabbed deeply on the left side of his chest with a 9-inch hunting or butcher knife. The victim was not identified. And possible trespassers with possible evil intent were observed by a Hamilton Lane resident.

Troopers in the Valley Sunday, April 6

*After responding to attempted burglaries at Caves Pharmacy, the Goodwill store and DQ, Luey M. Glenn, 25, was cited and released on charges of possession of meth, two counts of attempted criminal mischief, attempted second-degree burglary and two counts of criminal mischief. He was taken to Three Rivers Community Hospital in Grants Pass for a voluntary mental health evaluation.

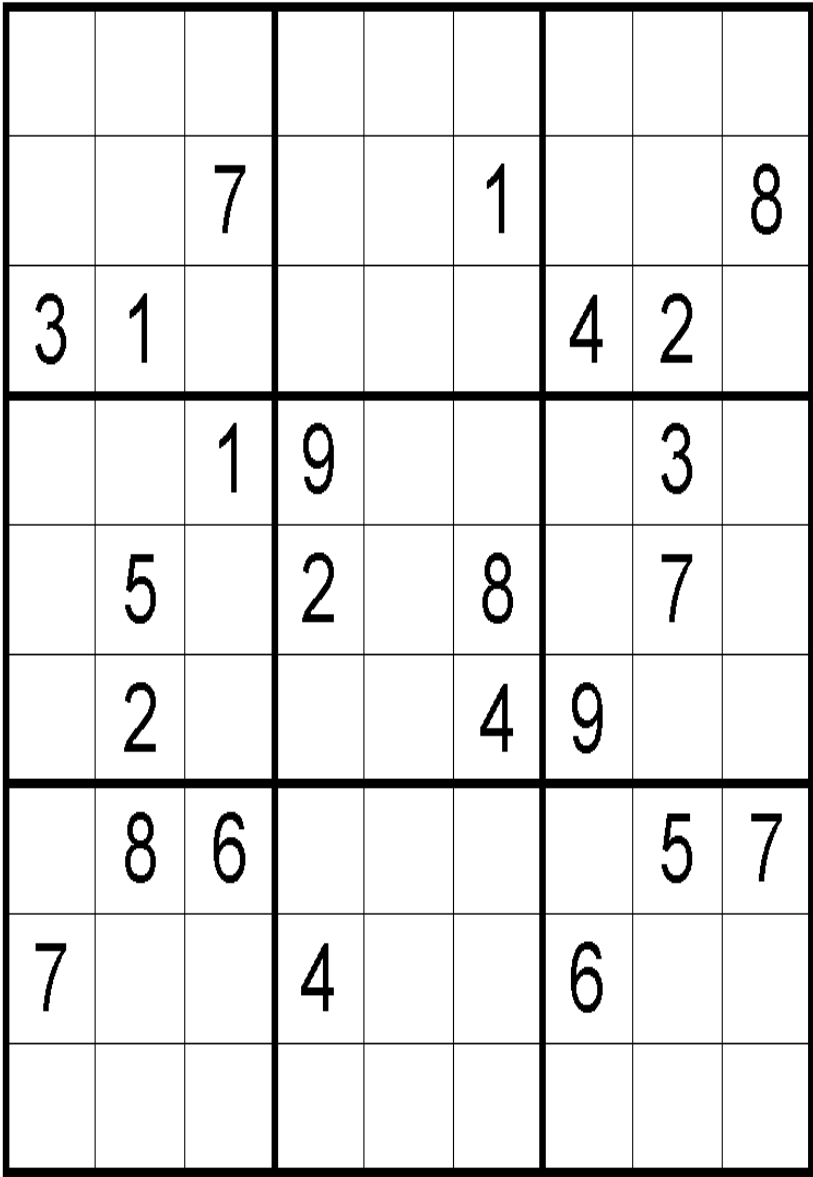
