

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor’s Note: Factual information for ‘Tales’ is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Oct. 6

*A restraining order (RO) was served by a Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) deputy on Green Valley Drive at 7:57 a.m.
*Oregon State Police (OSP) advised JCSO of a death due to natural causes on Burch Drive.
*In Downtown Cave Junction a citizen who had reported theft of a van found it even though it had different license plates and was painted a different color. A deputy found the original plates and returned them to the owner on Rockydale Drive.
*Someone who “sounded crazy or high” was making noise on someone else’s property in the 7000 block of Takilma Road. A deputy checked, but the noise maker was not located.
*Theft of a 1955 Chevy pickup truck was reported from W. River Street.
*Tenants in CJ said that their landlord told friends that he is going to “do something” to them and that he has keys to their house. They also said that the landlord on two occasions has pointed a gun at them and that he might have his vehicle hidden on a CJ parking lot.

Outside the Valley

*Among a staggering 27 calls was one reporting that a man was attacked by people with baseball bats in the 2000 block of Rogue River Hwy. The complainant said that the person involved likely is a drug dealer and would avoid law enforcement contact.

Tuesday, Oct. 7

*Not liking “living next door to crazy neighbors” was part

of a call from a CJ resident. It was stated that the neighbors keep harassing the complainant and that they even phoned OSP with false reports about them being outside waving around a gun. The complainant said that an OSP trooper hung up on them in the latest call.
*At S. Kerby Avenue and Schumacher Street a three-wheeler was impounded after the driver was cited on charges of driving while suspended and unlawful operation of an off-road vehicle. The driver’s name was not included in the log.
*Cedar Yandell (date of birth not listed) was taken into custody on Lister Street on a charge of probation violation.

Outside the Valley

*Eighteen calls logged including one for a deceased woman approximately 72 who apparently fell from her bathtub and broke her neck. And a rope team was requested to assist at a scene on a county road where an 18-wheeler went off an embankment.
*Some dude in the 22000 block of Redwood Hwy. claims that a neighbor is falsely accusing him of being a Peeping Tom because, he says, if the curtains are left open he has a right to look as long as he’s not on their property and the neighbor has a right to close the curtains. The log notes that there have been “prior reports” from the neighbor about the complainant peering into a window at their daughter.
*Some sort of contact was attempted in the 6000 block of Rockydale Road, but a woman there said that she knows nothing.

Outside the Valley

*Nine calls today.

Friday, Oct. 10

*Shortly prior to 10 a.m. in Downtown CJ a disturbance

was reported, which included a statement by the complainant that another guy pulled a gun and pointed it at him in a dispute about blocking a driveway. However, witnesses and video tape seemed to show that the man with the gun was justified, as he has a concealed weapon permit, and didn’t point the gun; he just held it up for viewing.
*Trespassing, including a man spending the night in a sleeping bag, was complained about on Walters Drive.
*Slimy punks stole gasoline and the filler pipe cap from an Early Head Start bus on E. River Street.
*It appears that a fence was cut so that ATV riders could get through onto private gated property on E. Fork Circle across from Schumacher Street.
*Extremely ill-mannered people in a small, noisy pickup truck that seems to lack doors and has only one headlight was the topic of a call from Lakeshore Drive. The complainant said that the driver was terrorizing people and that he drove directly at his wife and damaged their property. It is stated that the vehicle has been used to damage road signs and cause other destruction. A report is pending on failure to leave name at the scene of an accident.
*Reported trespassing, including what’s called an illegal fence, in the 900 block of Caves Hwy. was termed a civil matter.
*Theft of a computer left in a CJ business by a customer was reported.
*Harassment by a family member was cited on Lakeshore Drive. An RO was suggested.
*At W. River Street and Redwood Hwy. a deputy was flagged down for an unspecified reason at 1 p.m.
*In the 23000 block of Redwood Hwy. a deputy removed a semitruck tire from the roadway.
*Tenants with moving-out time were moving out on E. River Street.

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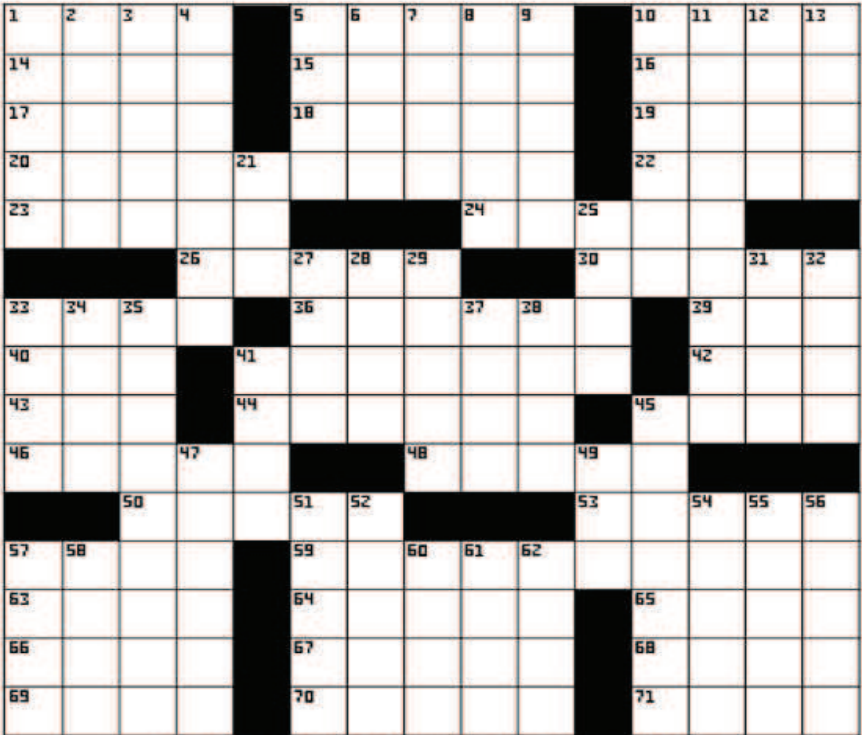
