

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor's Note: Factual information for 'Tales' is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Wednesday, Oct. 8

*A Schumacher Street resident said that she is tired of "harassment by tweekers and their friends" who live next door. She said that the last straw occurred the night before when she and her husband "were held at gunpoint" by the neighbor, who is accused of screaming at them and threatening to kick their asses. A review by Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) showed "only a flashlight." The woman was advised of her options.

*There was a collision involving a car and a school bus at 8:49 a.m. at Takilma and Waldo roads. There were no passengers in the bus, but the driver, who not identified in the log (NIL), was trapped due to downed power lines. Pacific Power responded, and the car driver, (NIL), was cited on a charge of failure to obey a traffic control device. (It's likely that Illinois Valley Fire District (IVFD) and American Medical Response also rushed to the scene, but the log doesn't list them.)

*From the Selma area there

was a 911 hang-up call from the 18000 block of Redwood Hwy. at 11:27 a.m. The call likely was due to a child playing with a telephone, noted JCSO.

*The owner (NIL) of a Schumacher property stated that squatters at their site started a fire and that IVFD sent them a bill. Prior incidents, said JCSO, indicate that transients are paying rent to stay in a shed.

*Following a reported assault by one I.V. High School (IVHS) student against another (both NIL), the parents and school officials were going to handle the matter.

*Apparently a traffic accident in the area caused a residential burglar alarm to sound in the 7300 block of Rockdale Road.

*Someone on Draper Valley Road was/is the apparent recipient of a restraining order or such.

*A Cave Junction woman identified the suspect she accused of taking her wallet and ID from her car while she was in a CJ business. A report by JCSO was

*In a wooded area in the Schumacher/Kerby Street area a deputy located a stolen vehicle that had been slightly damaged. Jerry's Towing hauled it away.

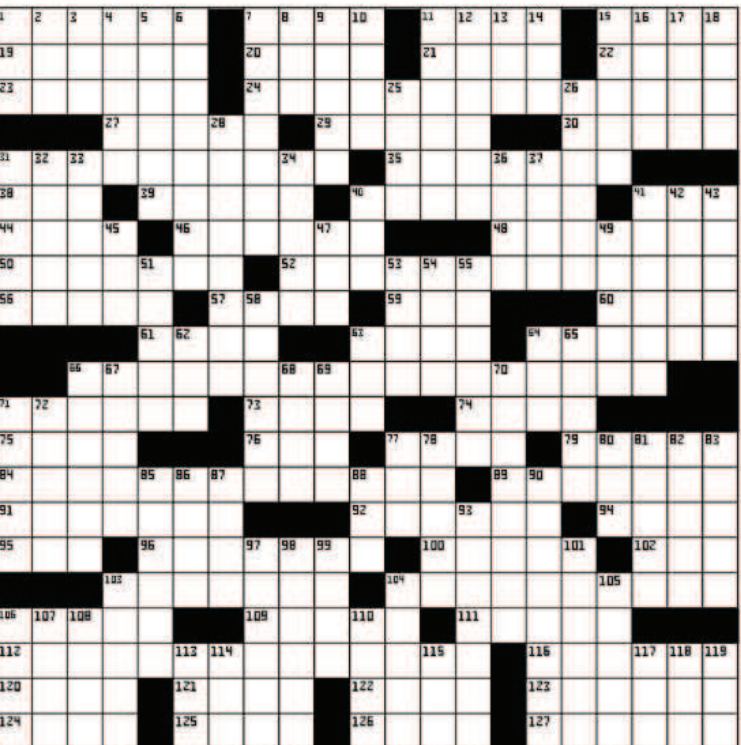
