

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor’s Note: Factual information for ‘Tales’ is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Nov. 17

*There was a residential intruder alarm at 9:34 a.m. in the 900 block of Caves Hwy. The call was logged by Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) as beyond available resources (BAR).

*Following a 911 hang-up call from Eight Dollar Road it was determined that “everything was Code 4.”

*JCSO received a call from S. Old Stage Road about a CO2 cartridge stuffed with an unknown substance and with a fuse that a guy had held onto for about the past 10 years. A friend with U.S. Army ordnance experience apparently advised that was dangerous. JCSO notified the Oregon State Police bomb squad.

*Among 17 calls and incidents was one in which a man said that humanity would end if his dog wasn’t at the county animal shelter. The dog had been adopted; no word on when the end will come. Another call involved a fellow who claimed that his wife pulled a knife on him at the Odd Fellows Cemetery. (This could have been a grave situation.)

Tuesday, Nov. 18

*Mighty quiet in the Valley with only the following call.
*There was some sort of complaint in Cave Junction about some sort of welfare check being needed, but the squeal was termed “unfounded” by JCSO.

Outside the Valley

*Of 16 calls and incidents one was about a motorist (NIL) stopped at Redwood Hwy. and Riverbanks Road and cited on a charge of driving 78 mph in a 55 zone, and warned for a defective rear light. Another came from a Grants Pass U-Haul dealer who said that a ramp trailer was stolen in July this year and a tow dolly in September 2013.

Wednesday, Nov. 19

*In Cave Junction someone asked for assistance in picking up a child whose mother is a known drug user. There was “negative contact.”
*A motorist (NIL), stopped at Caves Hwy. and Junction

Avenue, was warned about a defective head light.

*Someone phoned about a woman with a beer at the Selma Post Office. The caller also advised that the gal has a big handgun and despite the beer was continuing to drive.

*A complaint about a man driving a car and masturbating while on Interstate 5 resulted in him being detained and possibly arrested when he reached Cave Junction. (Details, including the name of the person, who might be a fugitive, were blocked in the log).

*At Redwood Hwy. and Laurel Road a motorist (NIL) was warned about defective brake lights. At Redwood Hwy. and Pinewood Way another motorist (NIL) was warned about speeding.

*Somewhere in CJ (details blocked) a possibly intoxicated woman (NIL) was detained and then taken to the Dept. of Corrections for lodging after complaints about her actions at a store. She was said to be uncooperative and that she punched an employee.

*Twelve calls today.

Thursday, Nov. 20

*Logged for information was data about a CJ woman whose ex-husband showed up and was causing problems. She also reported that he recently pointed a gun at her boyfriend.

*Illinois Valley Funeral Home responded to the 32000 block of Redwood Hwy. after a granddaughter found her granddad dead on the floor.

*There was a traffic stop (data involved missing/DIM) at Redwood Hwy. and River Street at 1:25 p.m. followed by a backup situation five minutes later (DIM) in the 25000 block of Redwood Hwy.

*Another 12 calls including one resulting in the arrest on Monument Drive of Douglas Anthony Raymond, 35, on charges of domestic menacing, second-degree assault, possession of meth and more than an ounce of marijuana. He was taken to county jail in GP.

Friday, Nov. 21

*Trespassers possibly are planning a big burglary at I.V. Building Supply, based on what employees found when they arrived at work. No employees responded to an alarm earlier

because they thought it was caused by a cat (NIL).

*An alarm at 1:39 p.m. from S. Kerby Avenue was termed BAR by JCSO.

*In Kerby a brother and sister (NIL) were fighting. They were separated and the landlord asked that she be “trespassed” should she return.

*There was some sort of incident in connection with Hummingbird Road residents and their daughter, who wasn’t dropped off after school because there was no parent waiting for her.

*Seventeen log items including several non-emergency calls listed as BAR.

Saturday, Nov. 22

*From Deer Creek Road there was a call that “Jason Bergstad was at the location yelling and threatening to shoot the reporting party.” The latter stated that in the past he (the suspect) has shot at him using a .22 pistol and rifle. JCSO provided options for dealing with the matter, and it was indicated that restraining orders would be obtained by the complainant and neighbors.

*Assistance was provided American Medical Response following a call from a woman in O’Brien who said that her cancer-stricken husband was taking dangerous actions and acting oddly.

*Community Oriented Policing was noted at the CJ Subway.

*No injuries were listed following what was called a two-vehicle rear-end accident at Takilma Road and Holland Loop at 2:53 p.m. Drivers (NIL) exchanged information.

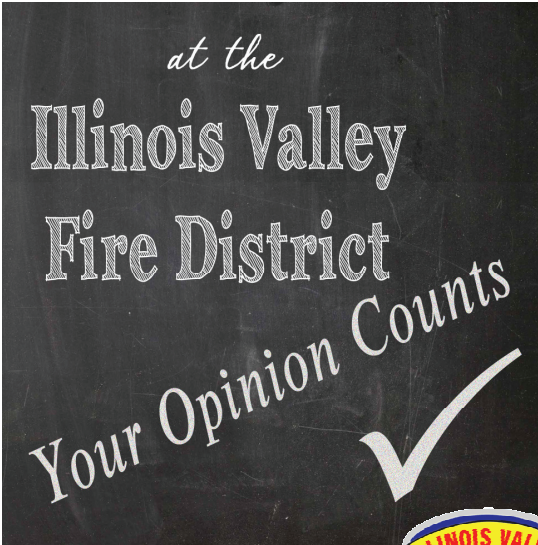
