

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor's Note: Factual information for 'Tales' is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Dec. 1

*Someone unidentified reported that in connection with recent vandalism "in the park," on the preceding Saturday night they saw a certain "vehicle engaging in further vandalism." (It is unclear from the log whether the park referred to is Jubilee Park or River Valley Village Mobile Home Park. It also is unclear whether a human being was involved or if said vehicle is named Christine).

*There was a call from the 33000 block of Redwood Hwy., maybe from a business, that "possibly on Thanksgiving someone cut the propane line and took the regulator."

*At Western Plaza in Cave Junction a motorist (Name Of Operator Driving Lacking Elucidation/NOODLE) was cited on a charge of driving 72 mph in a 45 zone.

*At the Junction Inn at 3:38 p.m. a deputy did something.

*Following a foot pursuit after a traffic stop at Raymond Street and Sherwood Avenue a deputy cited someone (NOODLE) on charges of driving while suspended, failure to yield to an emergency vehicle, lacking insurance, using switched license plates, and possession of marijuana. The vehicle was impounded. It is indicated that the motorist's passenger, who also ran, was not apprehended.

*Near milepost 28 of Redwood Hwy. at 4:53 p.m. a deputy backed up an Oregon State Police (OSP) trooper or troopers due to "lane blockage."

*The area of Ollis Road was patrolled for approximately 10 minutes beginning at 6 p.m.

Tuesday, Dec. 2

*Originally posted as a disturbance, there was a situation at Shop Smart Food Warehouse involving a man who was "confrontational and belligerent with employees" because "they didn't have what he needed." An employee "trespassed" him, and she was advised to phone 911 if the angry fellow "came back" or if there were "any more problems with him."

*Upon finding a dead deer near the roadway entrance to the Siskiyou Community Health Center, a deputy relocated the critter, and ODOT was to be notified. (It was not known if the cloven-hoofed animal had gone to the site seeking medical aid.)

*OSP notified JCSO that a cow (name unavailable) was running loose in the area of Caves Hwy. and Holland Loop.

*Early Headstart reported the theft of gasoline from a school bus.

*From Wells Drive came a call that a truck was entered and ransacked, and that some items were stolen. A report was to follow on unlawful entry to a motor vehicle and third-degree theft.

*The unknown driver of what was described as a yellow truck was driving recklessly and might have been intoxicated, said a complainant in the vicinity of Dick George and Takilma roads.

*The 3000 block of Waldo Road was patrolled.

*OSP notified JCSO about an attempt to locate someone on Watkins Street. All other details were redacted.

*Trespassers, including people driving cars in and out of the property and others living in an RV, were reported at a vacant home in the 6000 block of Westside Road.

*A Cave Junction real estate office contacted JCSO. No details provided.

*At Redwood Hwy. and River Street a motorist (NOODLE) was warned about a defective brake light. Later at the same location a motorist (NOODLE) was warned for no brake lights, and after a consent search a deputy seized less than 1

ounce of marijuana. The person's probation officer "will deal with on later date."

*Casie Lee Shaffer, 31, was arrested under three warrants on Caves Avenue, and a charge of possession of heroin was referred to the D.A.'s office. The warrants were for failure to comply (FTC) with terms of probation.

*A burglar alarm on Aquarius Way was logged by JCSO as beyond available resources (BAR).

*In Kerby a motorist was cited on a charge of driving 62 mph in a 45 zone, and warned for having white lights to the rear. At Redwood Hwy. and Hanby Lane another motorist was warned about a defective head light; and at Laurel Road another person was warned for defective side lights; another was warned at Finch Road for a defective tail light. Back at Laurel a motorist was cited on a charge of driving 68 mph in a 45 zone. In all five cases it was a NOODLE situation.

Wednesday, Dec. 3

*Kerby Avenue residents reported the theft of a Schwinn mountain bike valued at \$700 from next to the front porch in a case of second-degree theft. They added that the sneak left the four children's bikes that were next to the 21-speed.

*Near milepost 17 of Redwood Hwy. in Selma a deputy checked on someone and found them to be OK; they were waiting for a co-worker.

*A RO was served on Sawyer Avenue.

*Theft of a car from Hamilton Avenue was complained about. The spare key might have been in the 1993 vehicle, the owner said.

*Her son doesn't have a license, said a CJ mother, but he drove away in his own vehicle.

*A warrant was served on McMullen Creek Road.

*At various CJ locations motorists were warned for the following: defective brake lights (two persons), speeding, improper display, failure to use a turn signal,

disobeying a "Stop" sign, and defective mud flaps. Each situation was a NOODLE matter.

*ODOT was to be advised that there was a bunch of glass on the asphalt at the intersection of Redwood and Caves highways.

*Kyle Matthew Nelson, 23, was arrested on S. Old Stage Road under a statewide felony warrant listing parole violation after a complaint that someone was "breaking stuff and throwing stuff." He was taken to county jail.

*Diesel fuel was said to be on the roadway at Redwood Hwy. and Hanby Lane. A crew working nearby was to be notified.

*At the end of Krauss Lane a reported reckless driver was contacted; no crime was listed; persons involved exchanged information.

Thursday, Dec. 4

*One man with a gun and another with a machete threatened a Robinson Corner Road resident in his garage, he said. They were wearing camo clothing and ski masks. They were not located after the incident.

*On W. River Street at 10:29 a.m. a woman was said to be yelling and throwing stuff outside the complainant's home. She was advised that her call was BAR, but to call 911 again if the situation escalated or if the yellert/tosser left, and she eventually did leave.

*Neighbors on Shadowbrook Drive said that a man and a woman in a possible tweaker house were fighting, yelling and slamming doors. The "male half" was arrested in the past and "had a knife on him." No crime was noted today, and the "female half" was going to leave.

*Subsequent to a call from the 28000 block of Redwood Hwy. about a possible intruder it was noted that the caller might be incorrect in his report.

*A Pinewood Way resident had to be notified that a sibling had died in a fire in another county.

*There was a request for a welfare check on Dick George Road

involving a woman who seemed distraught.

Friday, Dec. 5

*Following a call from Dogwood Lane a deputy attempted to help a woman, but it didn't seem to work out immediately. She claimed that she was living with a couple to whom she gave \$500, and then they threw all her belongings outside and locked her out. She added that she believes they bought pot from a woman and are heading to another state. The offer of assisting the public was left open.

*There was "a verbal" in O'Brien involving a man and a woman, and they were said to be "throwing stuff." One was going to seek an RO.

Saturday, Dec. 6

*Harassment involving "threatening messages" and vulgar language from a woman were left on her cell phone, a Selma woman said. Whoever was calling said that she needed to put \$15,000 in a certain mailbox or she would be assaulted, she stated.

*BAR was the designation after some odd 911 hang-up calls from somewhere in the Valley that sounded like people wrestling and whistles being blown.

*American Medical Response (AMR) and Illinois Valley Fire District rolled to Redwood Hwy. and Lister Street after a woman (not identified) was struck by a motor vehicle. AMR took her to a hospital, but without using a siren or emergency lights.

*It seems that a couple in the Takilma area had a disturbance, but did not want a deputy to respond, as the woman left the residence. Later there was another disturbance involving other people, but there was no response.

*A woman who has been "trespassed" from most businesses in CJ was- causing problems again by harassing people and screaming at them.

Holiday electrical safety tips

- Do not run electric cords under carpets or across doorways.
- When you are not going to be home or when you go to sleep, shut off all electric decorations.
- Feel the outlet and cords from time to time to make sure they are not warm or hot to the touch.
- Never exceed safety recommendations on the packaging that accompanies your electric decorations.

Indications of electrical problems:

- Frequent shutting off of circuit breakers or blown fuses.
- Unusual burning smell with no obvious smoke.
- Flickering or dimming lights.
- Wires and outlets that are warm or hot to the touch.
- Discoloration of, or sparks from, a wall outlet.
