

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor’s Note: Factual information for ‘Tales’ is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Dec. 22

*A restraining order (RO) was served on Lone Mountain Road in O’Brien.

*There was a call from the Siskiyou Community Health Center (SCHC) that an injured man showed up with an unspecified injury said to be linked to an assault, but the victim said that he didn’t know what he was hit with and refused comment. AMR responded.

*A vacant residence on Old Stage Road was found open, and it was secured.

*There was an attempt to serve an RO in the 18000 block of Redwood Hwy. in Selma.

*Said to be “highly agitated,” some dude, Name Unavailable Totally (NUT), phoned 911 from Redwood Hwy. at W. River Street to report that “someone stole his stuff” and that he was giving them a chance to return the stuff before involving the law. He hung up on 911 and was not located.

*A motorist was warned about expired license tags in CJ. Another was warned about a violation not specified. Both were NUT cases.

*There were “hits at the conference hall door 2 and 3” (specific location not noted) in the 25000 block of Redwood Hwy. at 6:17 p.m. The alarm was termed Beyond Available Resources (BAR) by JCSO.

Tuesday, Dec. 23

*Oregon State Police (OSP) reported that two people claimed someone pointed a firearm at them in the 900 block of Caves Hwy. Either the suspect or the victims were in a Chevy Tahoe with Oregon plates towing a travel trailer with Arizona plates (data unclear). A report was to follow on menacing, first-degree burglary and unlawful use of a

weapon.

*Two ROs were served in the 28000 block of Redwood Hwy. And another in the 18000 block.

*A complainant in the 18000 block of Redwood Hwy. filed a report that while moving from the location the land owner during a discussion choked her and hit her head with his, and that he has threatened to “shoot her dog and place metal shavings in her motorcycle oil tank.” She was going to have a deputy accompany her to retrieve her belongings. Identities of those involved were NUT cases.

*On Deer Creek Road in Selma a mother said that her son acted violently toward her and that it wasn’t the first time.

*There was a report that two windows in the back area of Lorna Byrne Middle School were found to be broken. The complainant noted, “After searching through the footage of the security cameras. I was able to see at 9:23 p.m. on the 20th of December a person run up and throw a rock at the windows. It was fast and the video isn’t very clear. I’ve saved the footage if someone would like to see it?”

*Following a report that some weirdo in a “rusty-colored old Jeep-type vehicle” was driving by and shooting what “sounded like a .22 handgun,” an OSP trooper and a JCSO deputy checked the area, but no suspect was located.

*There was a report by someone (name redacted) that “some time between Friday and Sunday the central air unit was stolen from behind the pharmacy building, which is owned by Shop Smart.”

*It was scam city when a CJ resident received a phone call from “Robert at Publishers Clearing House” that he had won a 2015 Mercedes Benz and a certified check for \$980,000.” The “winner” declined to meet “Robert” at a store in Grants Pass.

*Upon stopping a vehicle towing a motor home with the drive line dragging, people were advised of

numerous violations, but apparently they had reached their destination on Hogue Drive.

*While returning to their Takilma Road home from CJ a family was seemingly chased by some oddball in a black car, who kept trying to get them to stop. The family father said that he’s sure the blond-haired person meant them harm.

*JoCo Animal Control dealt with a situation on E. River Street involving the possibility of animals at an abandoned house.

*An unoccupied vehicle was complained about, as it was parked at the end of S. Old Stage Road near the entrance to what’s called the “city park.”

*After a request for a welfare check on Dick George Road the situation seemed to be resolved.

*Second-degree theft was indicated in the 38000 block of Redwood Hwy. after an animal caretaker was hired temporarily and items were reported missing.

*Someone was upset because of what he described as nearly a head-on crash at Redwood Hwy. and Rockydale Road, and when he tried to get information from the person he accuses of being a reckless driver, the latter declined.

*Eluding was found unfounded in connection with a traffic stop on Westside Road, but the motorist (NUT) was cited on charges of driving while suspended (DWS), driving carelessly and lacking insurance. The vehicle was impounded.

*The driver of a motor vehicle fled on foot when approached by a deputy in CJ, so the vehicle was impounded.

*Although there was a complaint that a semi-trailer was parked on Waldo Road between Rockydale and Four Corners, it wasn’t located when a deputy went to see if it was a traffic hazard.

*In the 300 block of Rockydale a motorist (NUT) was cited on a DWS charge and warned for unlawful operation of an off-road vehicle on a

public roadway. The motorcycle was impounded.

Wednesday, Dec. 24

*Evil grinch broke into SCHC at 3:11 a.m. and took two laptop computers and a stethoscope. It was a case of burglary, theft and criminal mischief, all in the first degree.

*A pedestrian (NUT) flagged down an OSP trooper on Schumacher for some reason.

*When an alarm sounded in the 1000 block of Caves Hwy. at 9:15 a.m., JCSO tagged it BAR.

*There was a complaint from a man (NUT), flagged as hostile toward law enforcement, who claimed that someone stole \$1,000 from him and cleaned out his room at the Junction Inn. He told an OSP trooper that he was going to find the guy and “kick his ass.” Subsequently he was arrested after being contacted for trespassing and being disorderly, and taken to county jail under an unspecified warrant.

*On S. Junction Avenue a man under a restraining order exercised his 20-minute move-out allowance.

*JoCo Public Works removed a tree with an 18-inch base that was blocking both lanes on a blind corner in the 9100 block of Holland Loop.

*Jon Praise Williams, 35, was arrested on a charge of probation violation and taken to county jail after a complaint from Shop Smart Food Warehouse that he was “smoking weed and drinking beer” on the premises. Williams, whose attire included “a fur hat, blue jeans and a black jacket with diamonds in it,” was arrested at Speedy Mart “after a struggle.”

*JoCo Public Works and JoCo Search And Rescue responded to assist a stranded woman, who said that she was in snow up Greyback Mountain. She eventually made it out, arriving in California’s Siskiyou County.

*There was a 911 hang-up call from River Street, possibly from a young boy who misdialed.

*People were arguing on Fir

Canyon Road, and there was an indication of domestic violence.

Thursday, Christmas Day

*At noon in the 1000 block of Caves Hwy. a burglar alarm sounded. JCSO tagged it BAR.

*Some 15 minutes past noon a man on Ollis Road stated that his girlfriend seems to have taken off at 5 a.m. by stealing his car and removing money from his wallet. He thinks “she’s using meth again,” and noted that she doesn’t have a driver’s license.

Friday, Dec. 26

*Trespassing by a sloppy joker was reported at Redwood Hwy. and Deer Creek Road. There was concern that more than one trespasser might be involved. The joker was “trespassed” and given 24 hours to get out with his stuff.

*A welfare check was requested for a man and his children in O’Brien by his out-of-state son, who said he’s unsure what’s going on with caretakers. The outcome of the check was redacted.

*The transient son of a man on Ken Rose Lane punched the dad in his face and left. The complainant said that he “does not think he will return as he knows he will not be welcome.” The son’s probation officer was to be contacted.

*Seemingly intoxicated fellows were seen taking beer from a cooler and driving toward CJ from Illinois River Road. The Yuletide revelers were not located.

Sunday, Dec. 28

*A “Stop” sign at Takilma and Happy Camp roads was down.

*People shooting, possibly unsafely, in the 7000 block of Takilma Road were complained about, as the caller said that bullets in the past have come past their home. They described the firearms as “large caliber weapons.”

*Domestic violence reported on N. Junction Avenue was found to be “verbal only.”

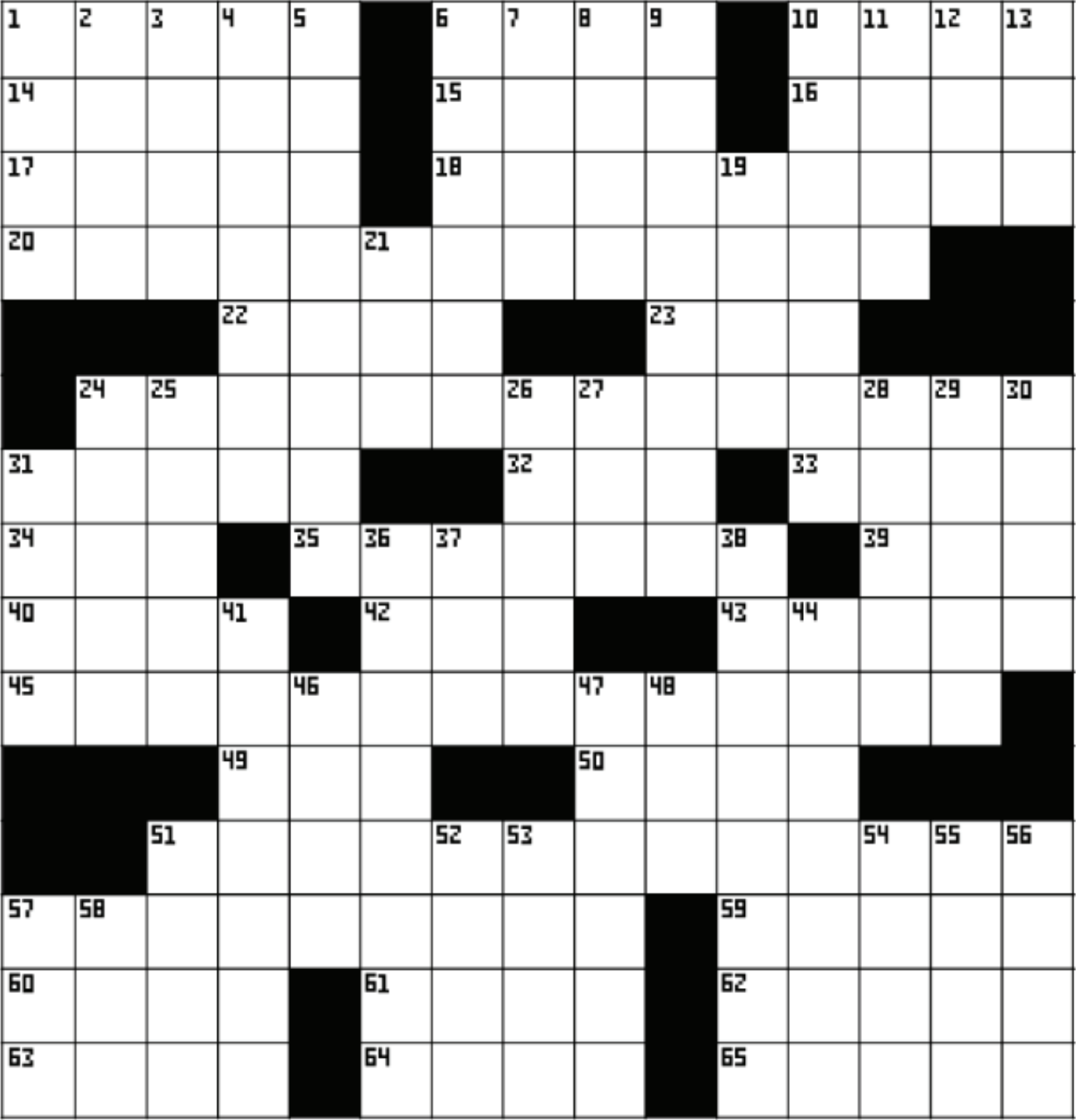
