

# Tales from the Rural Patrol

## Monday, Jan. 12

\*There was an attempt by a Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) deputy at 8:01 a.m. to serve a restraining order (RO) in the 200 block of Lakeshore Drive.

\*Someone (Name Of Person Excluded/NOPE) underwent a traffic stop in the 3200 block of Waldo Road and possibly was arrested. A report was to follow.

\*A woman (NOPE) complained that when stopped off the pavement in the 5000 block of Westside Road, someone "shined a green laser light into her windows and kept it there as she drove away so it was impossible for her to see in the dark." Later, she said, a woman (NOPE) posted on her Facebook page that she was the one who did it and that if she came onto her property again she'd do it again. The complainant is worried that it's a safety hazard, while people are driving, to have a laser light shined at them.

\*Her now homeless ex-boyfriend, said a woman (both NOPE) on W. River Street, entered her home without permission while she was away and took items, and "verbally threatened her with bodily harm if she didn't pay him some cash." A report was pending on first-degree burglary and second-degree theft by extortion.

\*Some creep took 5 gallons of gasoline from an Early Head Start bus on E.

River Street in a case of third-degree theft and unlawful entry to a motor vehicle.

## Wednesday, Jan. 14

\*The 6400 block of Holland Loop is listed, but the log does not state for what.

\*It seems that a red truck was driven through the Takilma/Dick George roads intersection the night before and crashed into a fence and knocked down a road sign. The property owner didn't want to pursue charges.

\*The operator (NOPE) of a vehicle missing the driver-side door and lacking license plates, stopped in the 2500 block of Deer Creek Road, was cited on a charge of not having an operator's license and warned for not having insurance. Some marijuana was found, and the person was advised to report to his probation officer the next week.

\*The driver (NOPE) of a vehicle on Burch Drive was warned for speeding.

\*In the 7900 block of Deer Creek Road an RO was served, and the deputy also seized a permit to carry a concealed weapon.

\*It was reported that the driver of a silver-and-red-colored pickup truck was weaving in and out of traffic in Downtown Cave Junction, and headed north on Redwood

Hwy. Neither the driver nor the rig were located.

\*Oregon State Police notified JCSO that a silver-colored car had been driven into a tree near the dam on Lakeshore Drive. No one was around, and the engine was cold.

\*A newspaper vending machine owned by the "Del Norte Triplicate" was removed from in front of My Place Cafe in Cave Junction. The newspaper manager said the machine cost \$550; usually had around 6 bucks in change in the coin box; and likely was taken on Dec. 27 or 28.

\*Domestic violence was reported by a woman (NOPE) on Dick George Road, who said that her ex-boyfriend (NOPE) grabbed one of her wrists and pushed her after kicking in the front door. She plans to renew the RO she had.

\*Damage to his vehicle was noticed by a resident of Watkins Street. The person (NOPE) believes that it happened in Cave Junction on Dec. 10 on one of two parking lots.

\*When a tree-trimming crew hired by Pacific Power went to an address on W. River Street, a woman who didn't want any cutting threatened to get a rifle. The crew left before that happened, and it is noted that the trees are quite close to primary power lines.

\*The driver (NOPE) of a vehicle stopped at Takilma/Dick George roads was "trespassed" from an address on Holland Loop, and might have been using a vehicle that's not his. And he might not have a license.

\*A motorist (NOPE) stopped in CJ was cited on a charge of not having an operator's license. A deputy gave him a ride home and

noted that the man "is upset due to relationship issues."

\*The peace was kept on W. River Street at 5:49 p.m.

\*Deputies handled 26 calls and incidents including one that might have been in the Valley, but it is difficult to tell because the entire log incident is redacted.

## Thursday, Jan. 15

\*Violation of an RO was reported in Selma.

\*Two female persons (NOPE) were held at gunpoint by a JCSO deputy at Redwood Hwy. and Hanby Lane in connection with having a stolen vehicle. A second deputy responded Code 3 to serve as back-up. The vehicle was towed, and the owner was arranging to retrieve it.

\*One person among a group at Forks State Park was accused by a park worker of threatening to assault him after he told him to pick up his litter and leave the park. Neither the accused nor any of the others were around when a deputy arrived.

\*A motorist (NOPE) was warned for speeding at Redwood Hwy. and Rockydale Road. Another motorist (NOPE) was cited on charges of driving while suspended and not having insurance at Redwood Hwy. and Lister Street, and warned for a defective side-light and not having a front license plate. The vehicle was impounded.

## Friday, Jan. 16

\*Illinois Valley Fire District and American Medical Response rolled to a house on Lakeshore Drive after it was discovered that a disabled

man phoned for assistance when he couldn't get up.

\*Two persons (NOPE) underwent field interrogations (FIs) on the Junction Inn parking lot.

\*Numerous guns were reported stolen from a home on Reeves Creek Road in a case of first-degree burglary.

\*Justin Brian Taylor, 26, was arrested in Downtown CJ on a charge of parole violation and taken to county jail.

\*An area of Bear Creek Road off Caves Hwy. was checked after a gate was found ripped off.

## Saturday, Jan. 17

\*Two reports of theft at the same CJ business were reported, and the complainant states that the culprits are known.

\*Many items were reported stolen from the city of CJ's wastewater treatment plant in a burglary said to have occurred on Jan. 10.

\*The operator (NOPE) of a vehicle in Downtown CJ was warned for lacking a license and for having a defective brake light.

\*Someone (NOPE) crashed a vehicle on E. River Street. A witness said that the driver hid in bushes and was carrying away stuff.

## Sunday, Jan. 18

\*Someone (NOPE) was contacted by a deputy in the 9500 block of Takilma Road and given a warning for trespassing, and told that he had 30 days to remove his trailer.

\*In the 12000 block

of Takilma Road a woman wanted a deputy to stand by and keep the peace while she obtained items from her husband, because she was fearful of being assaulted. She then apologized for making a false statement; was advised that JCSO does not provide such service; and the call was termed Beyond Available Resources.

\*Two people in two vehicles out Thompson Creek underwent FIs.

\*At Lakeshore Drive and Reeves Creek Road a citizen said that some sort of suspicious activity possibly involving a possible stolen car was occurring. The report was logged for information.

\*A man (NOPE) stated that "a kid and his father" (NOPE) were "doing donuts" in the 1200 block of Rockydale Road and that the child might not be old enough to be driving. The complainant added that they've thrown rocks at him (last summer) and have been harassing him for a long time. The complainant also said that he had information about criminal activity.

\*On Page Creek a woman was said to be trespassing.

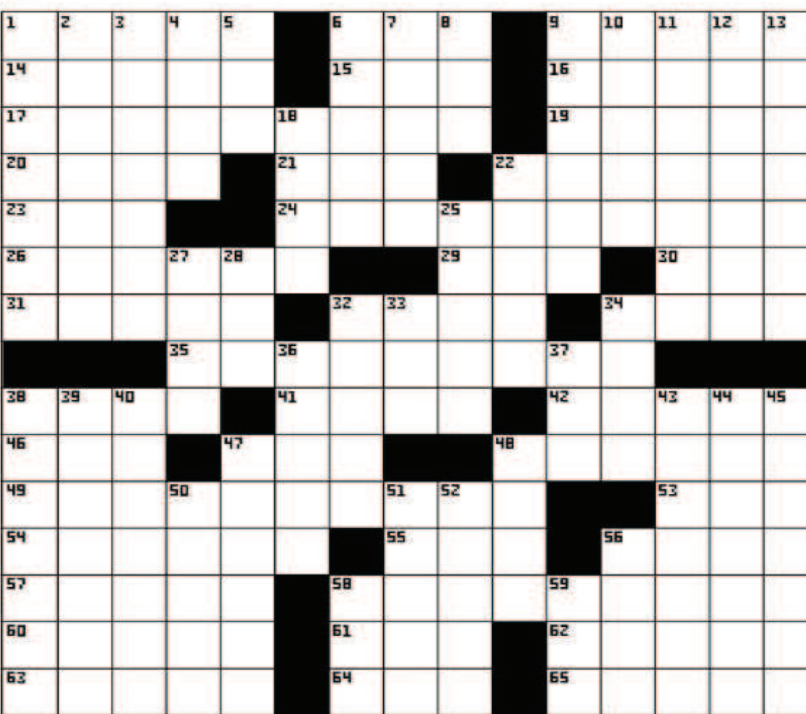
- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
