

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor's Note: Factual information for 'Tales' is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Feb. 2

*An Ollis Road resident complained to the Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) that he "has had multiple egging to his truck" on his driveway. He added that his pickup also has incurred broken windows and that the culprit drives "a small red car with high tail lights."

*The owner of vacant property on Old Stage Road reported that neighbors "removed 36 trees and left a big mess to have a dish satellite installed" and that he "was never asked or notified that said work was taking place." He wants his property cleaned up and restitution for the trees. He was going to have the dish removed.

*A restraining order was served on Barlow Street.

*On Watkins Street a motorist (Driver ID Missing/DIM) with two infants in his car was cited on a charge of not having an operator's license, and warned for failure to carry proof of insurance and the impoundment ordinance. And having an expired registration was discussed.

*Some sort of "attempt-to-locate" (ATL) situation occurred on E. River Street, but because the crux of the incident was redacted we can't report more than that.

*Thirteen incidents and calls listed.

Tuesday, Feb. 3

*Following a 911 hang-up call from S. Junction Avenue it was determined that the situation was Code 4.

*In Kerby a "highly agitated" woman who was acting violently and attacking anyone who came near her was taken into custody under a police officer's mental hold and taken to Three Rivers Community Hospital (TRCH)in Grants Pass. The transport was by an Oregon State Police (OSP) trooper, who responded to back up a JCSO deputy.

*Illinois Valley Fire District (IVFD) personnel extricated a motorist (DIM) from his car after he crashed it in the 4000 block of Lakeshore Drive around 12:25 p.m., and American Medical Response (AMR) took the man, who was asleep and suffered "lacerations to the head," to TRCH. A legal blood draw was conducted after the man woke up at approximately 2:26 p.m. His dog was taken by Josephine County Animal

Control.

*In the 25000 block of Redwood Hwy. at 12:58 p.m. a deceased person was reported. All other information was redacted.

*In the 24000 block of Redwood Hwy. at 3:18 p.m. there was an ATL situation. All other information was redacted.

*At Redwood Hwy. and River Street at 5:21 and 5:39 p.m. two motorists (DIM) were warned for expired registration and driving too fast for conditions.

*At 5:52 p.m. a fugitive was taken into custody in the 24000 block of Redwood Hwy. All other information was redacted.

*The logs contain 21 calls and incidents.

Wednesday, Feb. 4

*There were a couple of what appear to be civil paper situations noted at the I.V. Substation, one at 8:05 and 8:47 a.m. And one at 10:44 a.m. on Deer Creek Road.

*A man (ID redacted) stated that his mobile home on Westside Road "was sold as a real estate package around November 2012 and never was paid for" and "has since been removed." He was going to try to foreclose on the property and mobile, as he "still retains ownership papers." JCSO termed the situation a civil issue and he was advised of options.

*A motorist (DIM) was warned for improper display at Redwood and Caves highways.

*There was a report of a deceased person on Garner Road. All other information was redacted.

*Two vehicle stops of motorists (DIM) in Cave Junction by a JCSO deputy resulted in separate warnings for failure to signal for a turn and having a defective turn signal. And on Kerby Street an OSP trooper seized license plates as they didn't match the vehicle.

*At E. River Street and Laurel Road a "School Zone" sign was broken off at its base, and JoCo Public Works was notified.

*Two men were said to be "verbally fighting" on N. Hussey Avenue at 5:15 p.m., and a crowd gathered. One of them apparently left in a pickup truck. A deputy checked and found neither the men nor the vehicle.

Thursday, Feb. 5

*Harassment by a man against Bureau of Land Management workers near Thompson Creek Road and Briar Lane was logged at a complaint's request.

*Forks State Park was patrolled at 4:28 p.m.

*Following a 911 hang-up call from

Holland Loop it was determined that all was OK; the call was caused by a teen-ager who, it was said, accidentally pushed his emergency call button.

*Fifteen log items.

Friday, Feb. 6

*Numerous items including \$500 worth of tools, said a resident in the 23000 block of Redwood Hwy., were stolen from a work shop adjacent to a mobile home. JCSO determined that it was a case of first-degree burglary.

*At 11:35 a.m. a woman reported that her husband and son were in a physical fight on the porch. IVFD, AMR, JCSO and OSP responded. The son was taken into custody. Names? All DIM.

*At 12:15 p.m. emergency personnel were advised of "standing water over the road" from the 5000 block of Thompson Creek Road and beyond. It "gets worse the higher up you go, pretty severally flooded," it was noted.

*JCSO was advised by a homeless man living in his camper on Eight Dollar Road that he's been harassed by a fellow. He identified the latter as a homeless person in CJ with a full beard, approximately 6 feet tall, pushing a grocery cart. He is usually dressed, said the complainant, "in black fireman's pants with yellow striping" and "wearing an imitation sheriff's hat."

*There was a call from an O'Brien woman, who said that her son, 6, heard gunshots after being dropped off from a school bus in the 33000 block of Redwood Hwy. The woman is concerned "for her son's and everyone's safety" and said that she believes she knows the shooter's identity.

*Someone on Illinois River Road stated that two canoers put into the river from the first bridge and that neither wore a life vest. The people were contacted out of the water and advised to not re-enter it.

*JoCo Public Works advised JCSO at 3:33 p.m. that from the 1-mile marker on Reeves Creek Road the pavement was gone, and that the road should be closed.

*Animal Control was to handle a situation at the corner of South Shore and Reeves Creek roads that two horses were standing "in the lake." Some people were said to be upset although the owner said that the water was only a few inches deep. Animal Control said that the horses were safe, but that some people reported that the horses aren't "properly cared for in general."

*IVFD was to control traffic at what became the end of Reeves Creek Road due

to rainfall until Public Works could arrive. It was said that someone nearly drove into the hole that had been caused.

*On Old Stage Road some guy was threatening to slash car tires and did, it was stated, removed license plates from one vehicle. He was said to be the ex-husband of a resident.

*Logs contain data about 34 calls and incidents.

Saturday, Feb. 7

*OSP notified JCSO of a call it received from the night manager at the Junction Inn involving a man who was rented a room, but when he entered it, there were already people inside. It was supposed to be vacant. Apparently the creeps broke into the room. A deputy checked after the manager and a cook went to the room, but found apparently that they had fled.

*A young child dialed 911 from Lister Street. The 911 Dispatch Center was told by the child that he was watching "Scooby Doo" and that his mother was sleeping. All was well; the mother awoke.

*Some sort of incident occurred on Lakeshore Drive, but the entire log description was redacted.

*Bones wrapped in a blue sheet with electrical tape were found by a man at a location off Lister Street, and he thought that they might be human remains. However, it was determined that they were the bones of an animal.

*Trespassing and violation of a stalking order were reported on Lakeshore Drive by a house-sitter who said that a woman was photographing the residence. The man was advised by JCS that there was not a violation and that her appearance likely was "a fluke," as she was taking photos for a bank in connection with a reverse mortgage situation.

*There was a 911 hang-up call from Tycer Crossing that apparently was made in error.

*An elderly man phoned for help from rural CJ, saying that he didn't think that he could make it through the night without power or heat. He had tried to contact Senior Services, but the place was closed. JCSO termed the call "Beyond Available Resources" (BAR) and notified an agency to follow up.

*There was an intruder alarm from the I.V. Golf Course cafe, and it was tagged BAR.

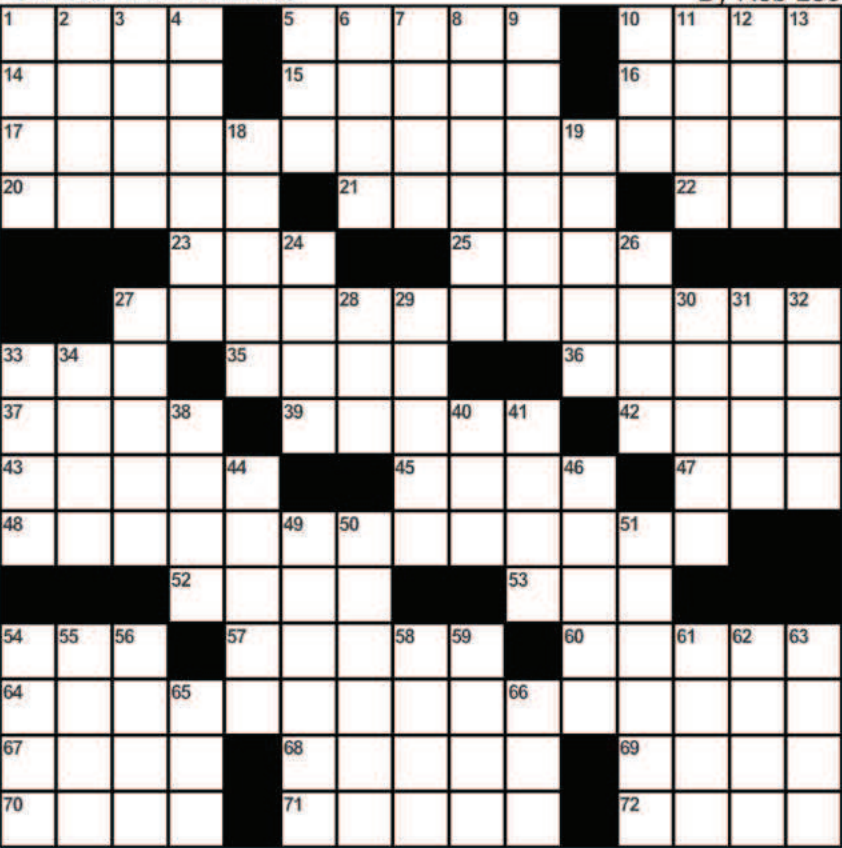

Fire Escape Planning

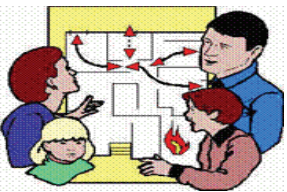


•Have a fire escape plan, and practice it twice a year (during the day and night), to make sure your family knows what to do and where to meet in case of an emergency.
