

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor's Note: Factual information for 'Tales' is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, Feb. 9

*It appears that a deputy went to the Josephine County Bldg. at 10:58 a.m., and was there for approximately 16 minutes, but the log doesn't state why. (Portion redacted.)
*There was an assist-the-public incident on Lakeshore Drive at 12:06 p.m., but the details were redacted.
*Theft of a \$250 bicycle from a carport on Ollis Road was reported.
*Something happened or there was a patrol event around 2 miles out Illinois River Road.
*On Redwood Hwy. in Selma a deputy stopped to check on a stopped vehicle, and found that the driver had phoned AAA for assistance.
*On Holland Loop a gunshot wound incident was logged, but details were redacted.
*At 3:31 p.m. a motorist (No Information/NI) was cited on S. Hussey Avenue on a charge of driving 60 mph in a 45 mph zone, and warned about failure to ignore red lights.
*A welfare check was requested on June Drive, as some people are concerned that an elderly person is being taken advantage of. Senior Services was notified.
*Some sort of disturbance at a business in Kerby was reported, as a guy wanted a refund for something, but eventually the matter was resolved.

Tuesday, Feb. 10

*Reported to JCSO by a Caves Hwy. resident in the

1000 block: "While clearing brush I found a loaded .22 semi-auto pistol on my property that does not belong to me. I obviously have no idea how it got there or who it might have belonged to. I want to turn this weapon in to the authorities. How do I accomplish that? Please respond!"
*In the 900 block of Caves Hwy. there was a medical call at 9:55 a.m., but details were redacted.
*Following a traffic stop at Junction Avenue and Terrace Drive a motorist (NI) was cited on charges of failing to provide proof of insurance, failure to obey a "Stop" sign, and having expired tags and registration.
*Someone, probably a man (NI), was contacted at W. River Street and N. Hussey Avenue for "urinating in public" and "providing a false name to police." He was taken into custody, and there were extensive details in the log, all them redacted.
*Oregon State Police (OSP) advised JCSO that the night before it received a call about a rollover crash with minimal damage to a pickup truck that landed on its wheels at Rockydale and Waldo roads and that when I.V. Fire District (IVFD) responded at around 12:28 a.m. no driver was located. It subsequently was stated that the driver, a woman, had been looking for her dog. When she went to retrieve the pickup today, it was gone. Later it was found on Holland Loop, but the battery was missing and there was "heavy ignition damage."

Wednesday, Feb. 11

*At a location off Hays Cut-off, a restraining order (RO) was served; and another in the 28000 block of Redwood Hwy.
*A motorist (NI) was

cited on a charge of speeding near milepost 31 of Redwood Hwy.
*The 3000 block of Waldo Road was patrolled.
*At Caves Avenue and Watkins Street a motorist (NI) was cited on a charge of failing to carry proof of insurance, and warned for having a defective brake light.
*Somewhere in metropolitan Cave Junction a man said that he "saw stars" after his wife pushed him when she arrived to pick up some of her belongings. He said that he'd seek medical aid, perhaps later, depending on his condition.
*In the 300 block of Caves Hwy. a motorist (NI) was cited on a charge of failing to carry insurance, and warned for expired registration and a broken windshield. And at Redwood Hwy. and Lister Street a motorist (NI) was cited on a charge of driving 64 mph in a 45 mph zone.
*From Patton Bar Road came a call that a neighbor had a man working, and that they were outside yelling at the complainant and her boyfriend that they would kill them. But that did not happen, and all seemed OK.

Thursday, Feb. 12

*At 6:55 a.m. an RO was served in the 28000 block of Redwood Hwy.
*The Page Mtn. Sno-Park was patrolled. And the relatively nearby Bolan Lake was patrolled afterward.
*There was a call at 12:43 p.m. about a couple having a domestic violence disturbance on S. Old Stage Road, and a deputy responded, but "due to parties being uncooperative and the female leaving prior" to arrive the matter was logged for information "at this time."

Friday the 13th

*In the 28000 block of Redwood Hwy. an RO was served.
*Violation of an RO in the 24000 block of Redwood Hwt. was reported to JCSO by OSP. A report was pending on RO violation, first-degree criminal mischief, and property damage plus failure to leave name at the scene of an accident.
*A woman in CJ stated that her husband "had started drinking again" and was in a bar, and that he does not have driving license.
*James Darron Patterson, 28, was taken into custody on Finch Road under charges of RO violation and criminal mischief. He was taken to county jail.
*There was a call from rural CJ by a man who claimed that his wife had stolen \$50,000 worth of gold. The woman indicated that the elderly man has an ailment and is incorrect in his accusation.

Saturday, Feb. 14

*There was a complaint from Patton Bar Road that a neighbor "has dumped trash in the gutter in front of her property and made threatening comments. He has also fired shots, which he stated to another neighbor, were meant to threaten complainant. (He) finally picked up the trash and piled it along her fence. Complainant states that there were at least 15 butane canisters in the trash trailer that he had. Has also hung chains, crosses and other items on the fence. JCSO determined that the situation was "unfounded as a crime and advised options."
*Someone on Walters Drive said that a nephew took a head light without permission.
*Burglary and theft, both in the first degree, were reported on Schumacher Street.

Reported missing are a large quantity of gems and jewelry, the title to a van, and notebooks containing the victim's Social Security and banking information.
*Following a 911 hang-up call from Krauss Lane, a verbal disturbance involving two women was located, but no crime.
*The park host at Forks State Park reported that people who assaulted him in October had returned. A deputy "contacted all parties involved" and a "compromise was reached."
*Back on Patton Bar Road a welfare check was conducted, although no one was located, said to involve concern about a woman who was crying and hysterical earlier.
*A 911 hang-up call came from W. River Street, but nothing untoward was located.
*In the 28000 block of Redwood Hwy. a woman lying the floor was reported. IVFD and American Medical Response (AMR) made entry, and it was found that the woman was deceased.
*AMR and a deputy (and probably IVFD) responded to the 9000 block of Takilma Road after a woman phoned to say that she had taken a bunch of pills and was losing consciousness. She agreed to be transported for medical attention.
*Some people on Garner Road had problems said to involve trespassing, a gun and who knows what all, ending with everyone involved wanting the information logged.

Sunday, Feb. 15

A motor vehicle traffic stop occurred at Redwood Hwy. and Waldamar Road. No other details were provided except that it happened at 11 a.m.
*Nine minutes after the

mysterious traffic stop above, a man (NI) was cited for having a dog off-leash in Jubilee Park, as well as having alcohol there. The person was cited into CJ Municipal Court.
*Forks State Park was patrolled from 11:27 to 11:36 a.m.
*At 11:40 a.m. a deputy was "flagged down" at the IVFD station on Caves Hwy. No details were listed.
*There was a two-minute-long security check at I.V. High School.
*The driver of a green Kawasaki dirt bike, "a juvie or young person," eluded a deputy twice in the area of N. Old Stage Road and Hanby Lane.
*Trespassing in the form of a car that incurred front-end damage after it was driven into a house on Patton Bar Road, causing "obvious structural damage" to the building, was complained about. The driver wasn't located; the vehicle was impounded.
*Near milepost 30 of Redwood Hwy. a motorist (NI) was cited on charge of driving 60 mph in a 45 mph zone. After that traffic stop the deputy was chatting with someone along the road concluding with an assist-the-public situation by providing contact info for the Del Norte County Sheriff's Office.
*Out Illinois River Road a motorist (NI) was slumped over the wheel, apparently more tired than intoxicated, it was indicated. He was found to not be impaired, and a family member came to get the vehicle.
*A woman in the 38000 block of Redwood Hwy. wanted another woman contacted and told to leave because, she said, the latter was smoking pot and causing her "great stress." She was advised to contact the landlord.

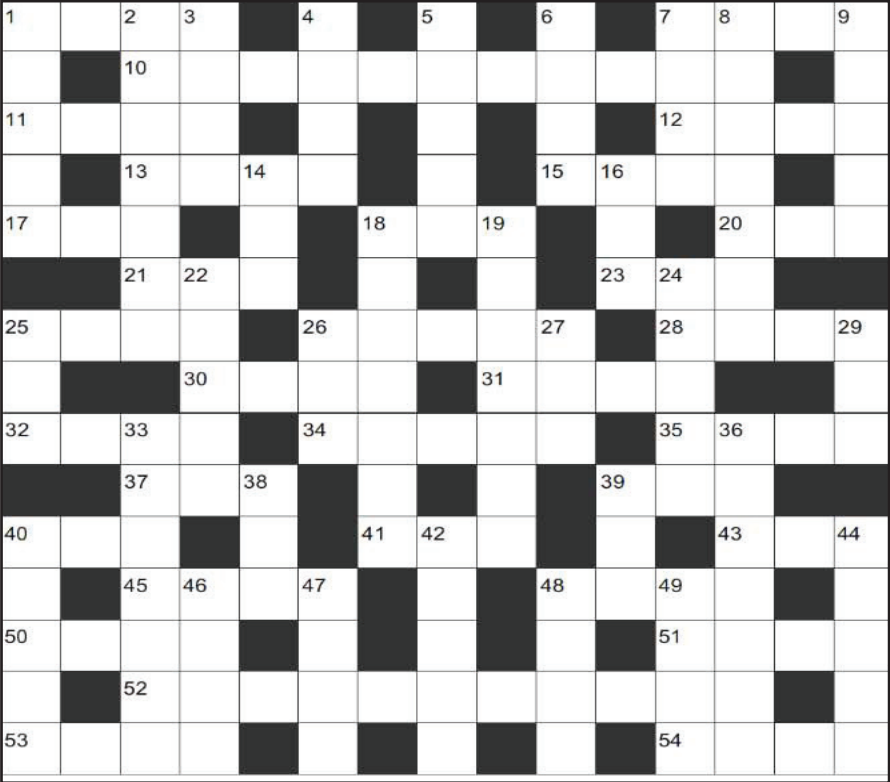
The Illinois Valley can be unpredictable, as we found out recently, so remember to be prepared for rain and high water.
