They are removing trees, leaving debris on adjacent property, and ignoring rules and guidelines regarding land development. The case was referred to the Josephine County Planning Department to address.

*An intoxicated father tried to take his baby from the 300-block of N. Sawyer Avenue at 1:37 p.m. The drunk dad was armed with a sawed-off shotgun and two handguns when he took off in an older tan Ford Ranger. There were no custody papers, and no restraining order in place.

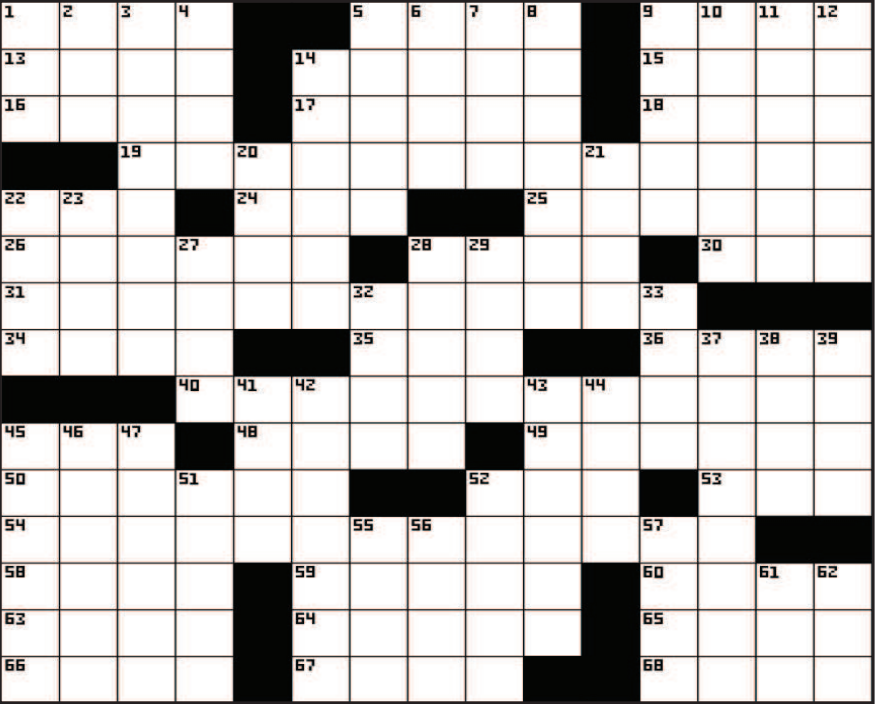
