

Valley to be filled with the sound of music

Two choral concerts will take place over the next 10 days, involving two different groups, both led by music director Kate Campbell.

The 3 Rivers Chorale’s acclaimed performance of the “Sunrise Mass” by Norwegian composer Ola Gjeilo will be performed May 14 at 3 p.m. at Bridgeview Community Church.

A weekend earlier, the annual RCC / IV Chorus Mother’s Day concert at Oregon Caves Chateau will take place May 8 at 4 p.m. This will be the fourth year the free concert will be held in the Chateau lobby. Music selections will include “Somewhere,” “Yellow Bird,” “White Sandy Beach,” “One Voice” and “Over the Rainbow.”

The Chateau formal dining room will offer Mother’s Day specials from noon to 8 p.m. and Caves Café will be open from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Call 541-592-3400 for dining or lodging reservations.

The “Sunrise Mass,” a new setting of ancient Latin text written in 2008, was first performed by 3 Rivers Chorale at I.V. High School in January 2013. Fifty singers from the Rogue and Illinois Valleys and a 20 piece orchestra gave two performances. About a third of the singers were ill with the flu at the time and could not attend.

Campbell stated, “3 Rivers Chorale is sponsoring a special reprise of this work, since it was so well received and many people had asked that it be presented again. We also wanted to give those who were unable to sing three years ago, an opportunity to perform this moving and hauntingly lovely full length mass for double chorus and string orchestra.”

Campbell said, “There has been great joy in combining our voices from various choirs to work on this uplifting music together. All other pieces in the concert will be performed solely by 3 Rivers Chorale.”

Also on the program are works by Mark Thomas, Giselle Wyers, Morten Lauridsen and Maurice Durufle’.

“Our audience favorite, the sing-along ‘Blue Green Hills of Earth,’ is now a tradition. Former Chief Ranger for Redwoods State Park, Marshall Neeck, will play soprano saxophone on this selection from ‘Missa Gaia,’ by Paul Winter,” she said.

“Many of the orchestra members are from the Rogue Valley Symphony and they’re mentoring two high school age musicians who will be joining us for the performances,”

Campbell said. “We are also happy to partner with new venue hosts: Bridgeview Community Church at 5181 Holland Loop Road and Bethany Presbyterian Church in Grants Pass.”

“Due to a grant from Illinois River Valley Arts Council, Illinois Valley audiences will enjoy reduced rate tickets. We do recommend that people buy tickets as soon as possible,” she said.

Tickets are \$12 for adults and \$5 for children age 12 and under. The concert is not recommended for children under the age of 5. Tickets are now on sale at Washington Federal Bank, 135 S. Redwood Highway in Cave Junction.

A member of both 3 Rivers Chorale and the quartet “3 Rivers 4”, Jeni Foster said, “This is going to be an exceptionally beautiful concert that will touch the hearts of all who attend. About a quarter of the choir are singers from the Illinois Valley. We are so appreciative of their participation and are well aware of the musical skill and talent that flourishes in your valley.”
