

Tales from the Rural Patrol

* Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) provided Community Oriented Policing (COP) at Illinois Valley High School (IVHS) at 11:42 a.m.

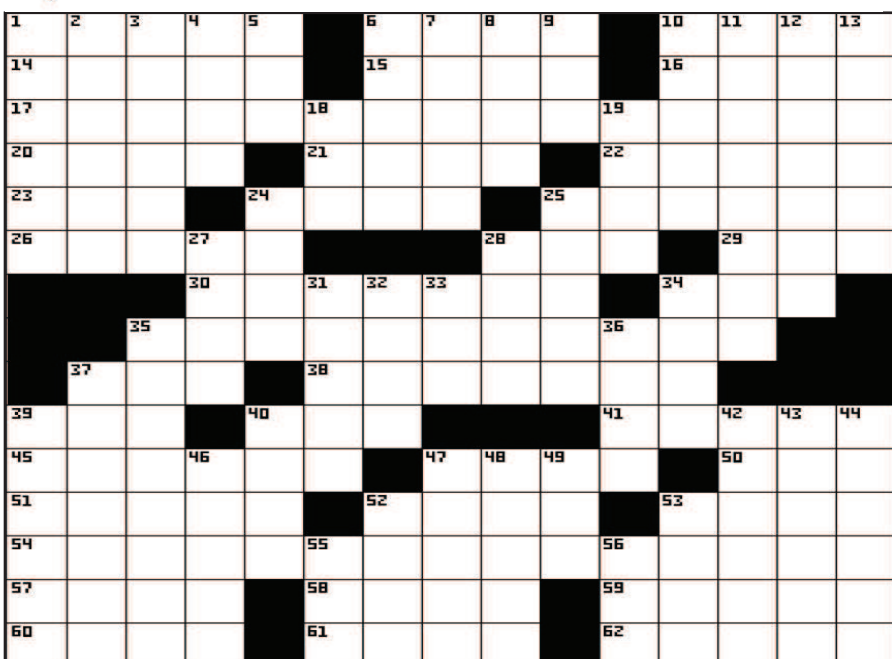
