## Monday, June 27

\*On June 25 at 7:23 p.m. someone in Paradise, California sent an email stating that a 24-year-old was believed to be missing from Illinois Valley because they had not heard from her in three days. When law enforcement went to the 28100 block of Redwood Hwy., her grandfather said he thought she was safe, just out and about, and that she was involved with drugs. Gramps did not know the so-called family member from Paradise.

\*The driver of a blue Scion was warned for failure to maintain lane and impeding the flow of traffic on Hwy. 199 at Bridge Creek at 10:29 a.m.

\*At 10:47 a.m. an occupied vehicle was observed in the 24500 block of Redwood Hwy.

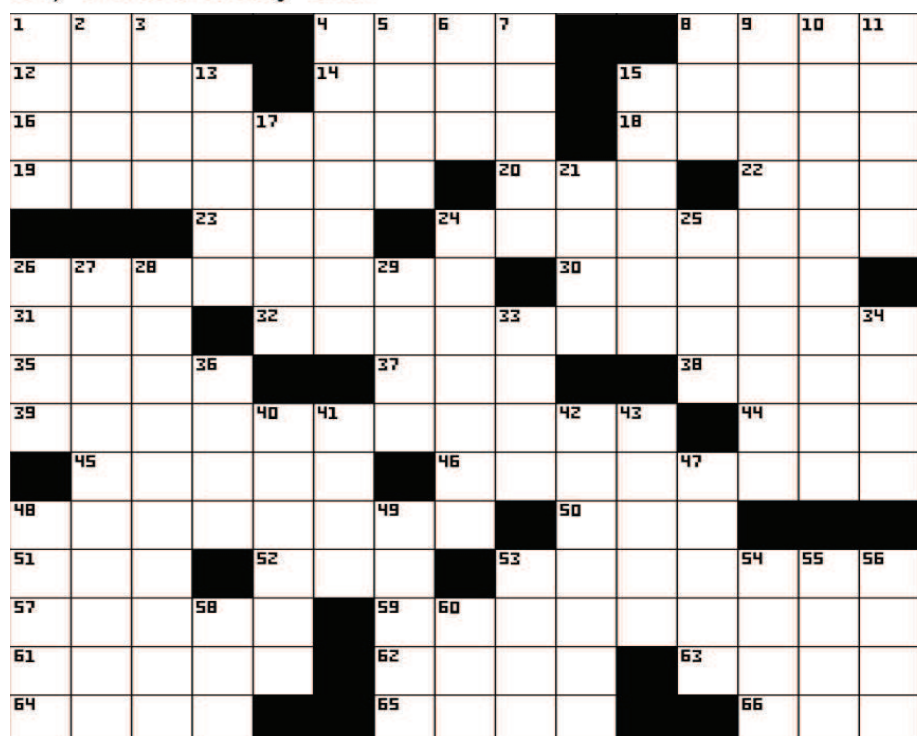
