

Tales from the Rural Patrol

She claimed that the landlord also filed fraudulent elder abuse restraining orders, police reports and a small claims lawsuit.

*A woman in the 200 block of Reagor Lane received credit cards issued in her name and the name of a stranger in Urbandale, Iowa. The same situation occurred three years ago involving \$3,000 in fraudulent charges. JCSO provided a case number so the bank's security department can investigate.

*JCSO assisted at a fire on Pinewood Way and Redwood Hwy. at 4:37 p.m. Two structures were

fully involved, with the fire spreading north to the wildland.

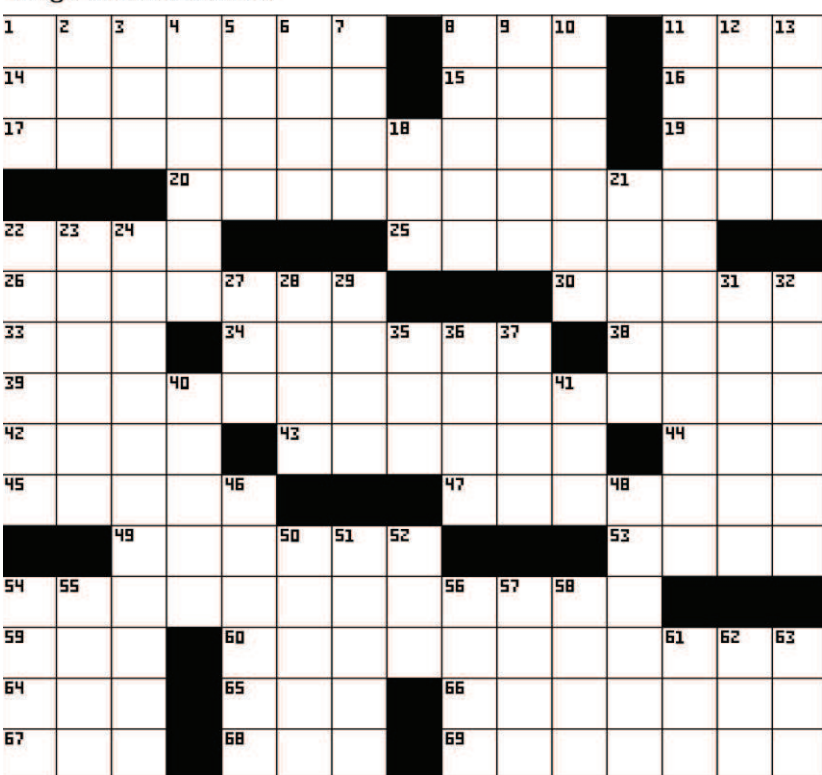

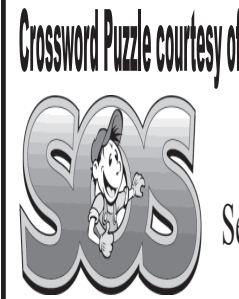
