

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Thursday, Sept. 1

* Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) met up with Oregon State Police (OSP) at 10:46 a.m. in the 1000 block of Lakeshore Drive. The officers were out with a black pickup truck that had no Oregon license plates, but may have had a temporary permit.
*At 2:37 p.m., a vehicle with California plates checked out OK at the Little Falls Campground on Eight Dollar Road.

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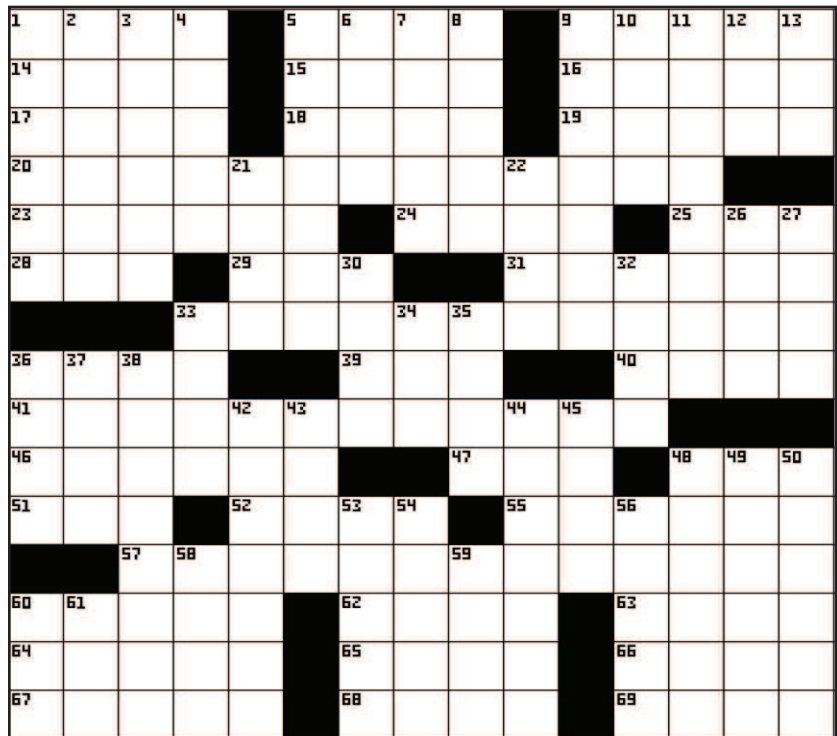
