*At 9:59 a.m. Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) responded to a report of a person who died in the 1100 block of Naue Way.

*At 12:25 p.m. a lost traveler flagged down a deputy in the True Value parking lot to ask for directions to the Oregon Caves National Monument.

*Law enforcement conducted a patrol of the Lake Selmac area at 12:38 p.m.

*Protection One Alarm Co. reported an activated alarm in the 100 block of Manzanita Lane at 1:15 p.m.

*A deputy made the rounds at one end of 6th Street in Kerby.

quad, and sent \$2,000 in iTunes gift cards to the “seller”. The rip-off artist then informed her that there was a problem with eBay, so she needed to send another \$1,500 for insurance. An alert employee at Fred Meyer saved her from losing even more money on this fraudulent scheme, but she never did receive her quad. An online report was filed with the FBI.

*No one had a clue regarding the unoccupied Ford Contour parked in the travel lane at the entrance to Jubilee Park at 12:39 p.m., so it was towed away.

*Burglars broke into the pump house at the Selma Center in the 18200 block of Redwood Hwy. on July 11 and removed the infra-red filter. The conservative thieves then re-routed the piping to close the system so that water was not wasted.

*A deputy checked a building in the 2400 block of Westside Road at 1:35 p.m.

*Law enforcement surveyed the area from Fernwood Drive to Rockydale Road at 1:58 p.m.
