October brings two annual events

Two beloved events which celebrate American heritage and culture are taking place during the next two Saturdays. Both will take place at the Selma Community and Education Center, 18255 Redwood Hwy.

On Oct. 8 and 9 the Annual Acorn Festival will offer both indoor and outdoor fun from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The free, family friendly event is sponsored by the Cultural and Ecological Enhancement Network (CEEN).

Hands on workshops offering Native American traditional skills will feature a noon acorn mush cooking demonstration by Lena Hurd using authentic Yurok baskets, as well as information on gathering and processing acorns.

Other activities include a nature craft table for all ages sponsored by the Illinois River Valley Arts Council, oak related displays and

vendor booths.

Once again, the festival will include a Scarecrow Contest which offers a \$100 prize for the best life-sized scarecrow. The scarecrows must be installed between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. the day of the event. There is no entry fee for this competition.

CEEN is a nonprofit working to increase cultural awareness and appreciation of the region, and enrich sustainable connections between people and the land.

A potluck feast of acorn dishes from around the world is scheduled for 5 p.m. Participants are encouraged to bring a side dish.

CEEN executive director Suzanne Vautier said, “The Acorn Festival was created to introduce area residents to Native American culture and celebrate traditional and modern uses for acorns. This local food resource has been used for thousands of years.”

“We invite the community to come connect with the earth and the change of seasons, learn about local native traditions and hang out with interesting folks!” she concluded.

On Oct. 15, the 5th annual Harvest Moon Hoedown will once again feature professional dance caller John Luna. Doors will open at 6:30 p.m. and dancing will start at 7 p.m.

The all-ages event is a fundraiser for Learning Through Arts in the schools, and other public benefit programs sponsored by Illinois River Valley Arts Council (IRVAC).

Luna was trained in Appalachia and is devoted to introducing more people to old-time mountain square dancing.

“Beginners are welcomed. We assume every person who gets out on the floor has never danced before,” Luna explained. “We walk a few folks through the steps for everyone to see before each dance begins. The dancers help each other. It’s about community, not competition.”

Live music will be provided by the 3 Rivers All Stars, featuring Ari Dwyer on fiddle, Jack Dwyer on mandolin, Kent Fisher on guitar, Sue Rutherford on stand-up bass and Eric “Swampy” Webb on banjo.

Luna honed his authentic calling skills in Virginia and explained, “Hoedowns and barn dances are a vital part of America’s heritage. Until recently, most people lived in farming communities and had to create their own entertainment. “Hoedown” literally means, put your hoe down and come join the harvest celebration.”

IRVAC vice president Fisher said, “Luna’s clear teaching style and upbeat energy make for a heck of a fun time. No special garb, experience or partner necessary so, y’all come and bring the whole family!”

Unlike previous years, only desserts will be available for purchase, with coffee, tea and water provided free of charge.

Admission is \$10. No charge for children 12 and younger, accompanied by an adult.
