## When using Alternate Heaters

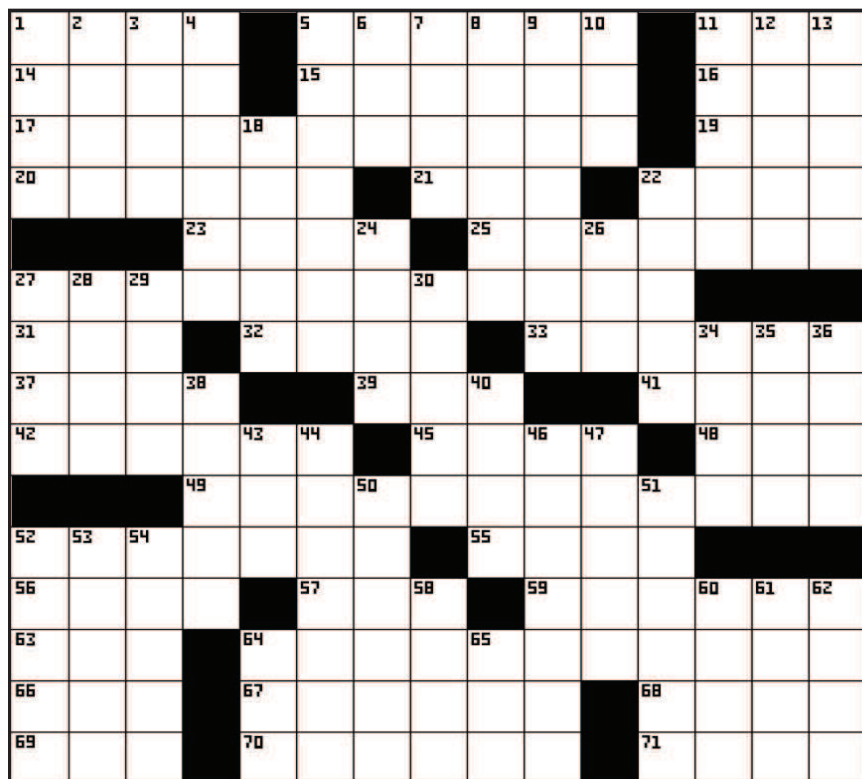
