

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Sunday, Oct. 23

*SOS reported an activated alarm on an exterior feed shed in the 400 block of Caves Hwy. at 10:22 a.m., but it was beyond available resources.

*Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) checked the Lake Selmac area at 10:49 a.m.

*Eight Dollar Road was patrolled at 10:49 a.m.

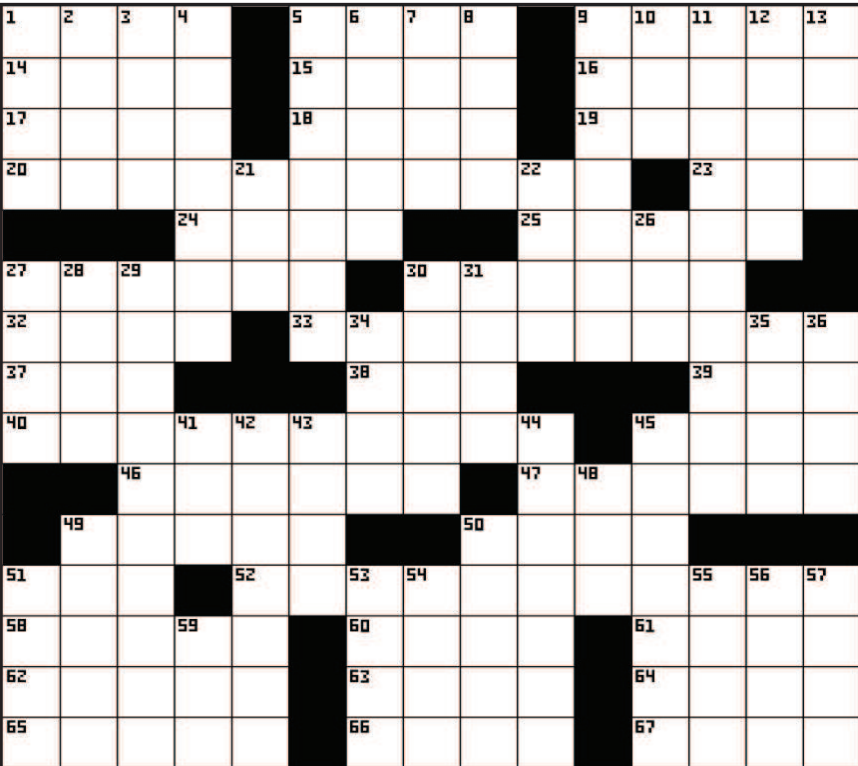
