

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Monday, Oct. 31

* Oregon State Police (OSP) faxed information regarding a red Chevy pickup truck which was off the roadway near Laurel Road and E. River Street at 9:20 a.m. No one could be found around the vehicle, which was cold to the touch. The truck, which was registered out of CJ, was gone when a deputy arrived from Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCISO).

*JCISO went to the 100 block of S. Redwood Hwy. at 11:33 a.m.

*Forks State Park was patrolled at 12:30 p.m.

*Trimmigrants in a rusty maroon Econoline van drove away from the 100 block of Dick George Road at noon. They were loaded with two aggressive muzzled dogs, six puppies, and all the belongings of a couple that they had been staying with. The ripped-off man of the house stated that “There will be blood” and he will “F” people up. He was advised to make a list of missing items, and a report will be filed for second-degree theft. (Hire local.)

*Investigation continued in the 100 block of S. Redwood Hwy. at 12:56 p.m.

*Premature Grinches played a rotten trick when they burglarized the Doug Hoskins Resource Center’s food bank in the 400 block of S. Junction Avenue. Reports were filed for second-degree burglary, second-degree theft and second-degree criminal mischief.

*JCISO provided community oriented policing at the Illinois Valley High School at 2:42 p.m.

*A headlight vigilante in a gray Toyota 4-Runner was driving 80-85 mph and brake-checking vehicles driving without lights at 4:58 p.m. The kook was spotted on E. River Street and Old Stage Road, but disappeared by the time JCISO arrived.

*Several campers who were staked out near Kerby Mainline Road at 11:40 a.m. were warned that they could only stay for 14 days. They had permission to stay on neighboring private property, but they were approximately 200 feet short of the property line.

*A deputy patrolled the area from Reeves Creek to McMullen Creek and Kerby Mainline Road at 12:10 p.m. A sign was stolen.

*At 12:45 p.m. a worried woman reported men firing high-powered weapons from her property in the 100 block of Warren Road. She heard three different firearms being shot behind her barn and trees in a knoll, and the shots seemed to be louder and closer so she was afraid to go outside. JCISO responded, but could not make contact due to a locked gate at the residence.

*A man was destroying things inside of what used to be Giant Burger in the 200 block of S. Redwood Hwy. at 2:05 p.m. Joseph D. Ainsworth, 38, was detained in Josephine County Jail on charges of second-degree burglary and first-degree criminal mischief.

*JCISO warned a driver for expired registration and failure to carry proof of insurance. The traffic

stop was on W. River Street and N. Redwood Hwy. at 4:07 p.m.

*A motorist at 1090 Laurel Road was cited for uninsured driving, open container and illegal display at 4:20 p.m. (420 at a cemetery? Day of the Dead celebration perhaps?)

*Another citation for uninsured driving and illegal display was given at 4:48 p.m. to an operator on W. Watkins Street and S. Kerby Avenue.

Wednesday, Nov. 2

*A business at 113 S. Caves Avenue reported a burglary at 10:02 a.m. The Robin Hoodlum stole \$500 in archery equipment, and did \$200 damages in the door. A report was filed for second-degree burglary, first-degree theft, and first-degree criminal mischief.

*Residents in the 1000 block of Dick George Road felt in fear for their life if they returned to their home, due to a prior assault incident on Oct. 30. At 12:58 p.m. the couple claimed that they no longer needed assistance.

*A belligerent dude swung his bicycle at a gal in the 6000 block of Lakeshore Drive at 12:07 p.m. She did not want to press charges, but there is allegedly a no-contact order on file due to a recent arrest for domestic violence. Notes were forwarded to the district attorney.

*Employees on Caves Hwy. returned to work on Nov. 1 to find power was out in half of the office. Pro Electric discovered that the outside breaker box cover was removed, and the breaker was flipped. Further investigation showed the casing on the front door had been removed, and there were cut marks around

the lock. There were also signs that the lock had been kicked, but no other damages were noticed. The computers showed the power outage occurred on Saturday at 8:30 p.m. A report was filed for second-degree criminal mischief because the door damages totaled \$200.

*Dogs mauled and killed a Chihuahua at a small hole in a fence line in the 300 block of N. Sawyer Avenue at 3:08 p.m. Animal Control examined the canines, but could not determine a clear aggressor or prove a crime or violation. Both parties worked together to secure the fence between the yards.

*At 4:11 p.m., it was reported that a decorative cannon was taken from the front yard in the 10000 block of Redwood Hwy. The 10-foot long, 4-foot high cannon is made from car parts, painted olive drab green, and valued at \$200. (Can’t miss it.)

*Investigation continued at the Old Stage Mini-Storage at 4:28 p.m.

- Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that can burn.



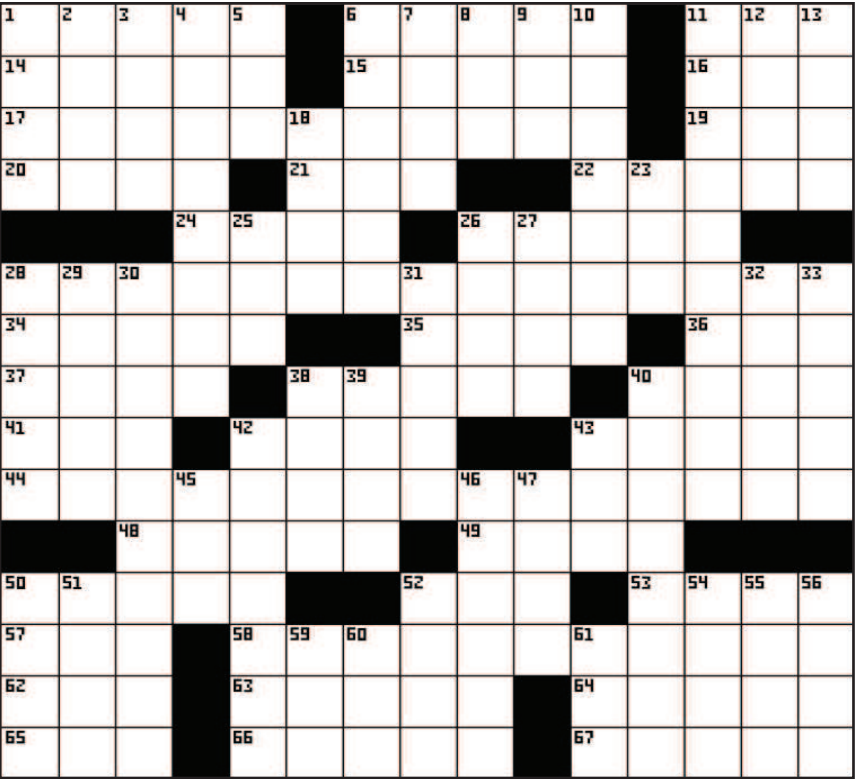
