\*A disorderly character was causing issues at 24342 Redwood Hwy. at 1:58 p.m.

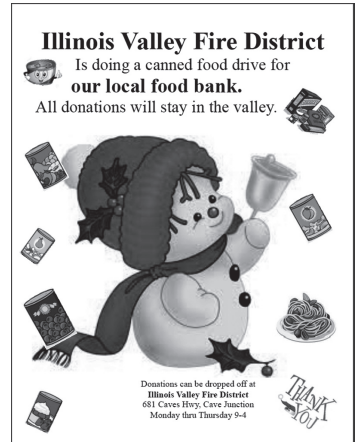

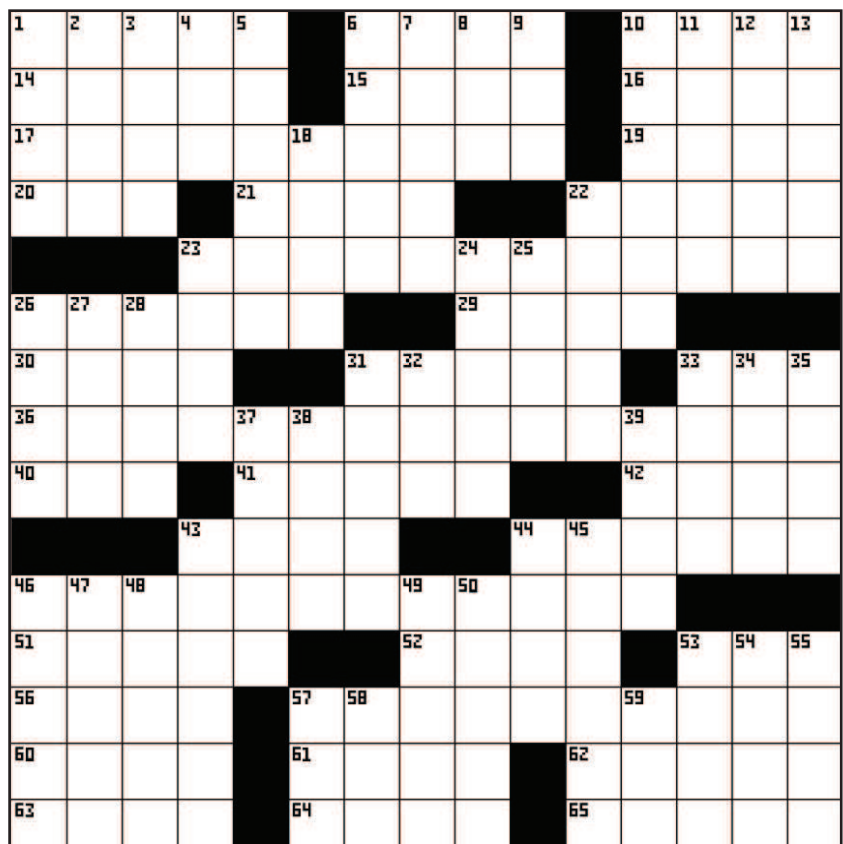
