

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Sunday, Nov. 27

*Everything was fine on Eight Dollar Road at 10:02 a.m.

*There was an unoccupied vehicle in a ditch near Waldo Road and Rockydale Road at 10:13 a.m.

*Another call came in regarding the vehicle in the ditch on Waldo Road at 10:35 a.m., but it was already deemed beyond available resources (BAR) by Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO).
