SENIOR COMPANION PROGRAM

United Community Action Network (UCAN) provides senior companions to the Illinois Valley. If you need assistance or friendship from another senior, this program if for you.

Senior companions help those who have difficulty with daily living tasks, such as shopping or paying bills. They are a valuable resource to help adults remain independent in their homes so they don't have to move to more costly institutional care.

One of the things identified in I.V. Wellness Resources' assessment of the Valley last spring was the need for guardianship and power of attorney information. Both of these require legal authority for someone to act in the stead of another individual.

A **Guardian** is court appointed, can be a concerned family member or another individual, and has legal authority to make decisions related to the person, their health care and finances when the person no longer has the capacity to do so for themselves.

A **Power of Attorney (POA)** is a legal document authorizing another individual to make decisions or take actions on your behalf. It can have very limited or very broad powers. Your agent can use the POA to assist you when you no longer have the capacity to make decisions yourself.

A **Conservator** is court appointed and has legal authority to handle your finances when you no longer have the capacity to do so. The conservator takes control of your assets and must handle them, including investments, for your welfare. Once the conser-

vator is appointed, the dependent person may not liquidate his own assets or determine how the monies will be invested without the conservator's consent.

Contact your attorney for assistance with any of the above legal authorizations.

Another need that was identified was information about **Advance Directives**. An Advanced Directive is a legal document naming another person to represent and/or clarify your health care and end of life decisions when you are unable to speak for yourself. End of life decisions relate to resuscitation, tube feedings and other life-saving or life-extending measures that you have already identified. A **POLST (Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment)** addresses your desires in an emergent situation and must be signed by your physician. Without a POLST, an emergency responder must resuscitate regardless of your wishes.
