What is HASL?

HASL is our local Center for Independent Living and it covers Josephine and Jackson counties. It is consumer-driven by demand and by a need and desire for representation by and for people with disabilities. Their sole governing mission is to maximize the quality of life for people with disabilities by promoting equal access and equal opportunity.

Core services include training individuals to help them gain skills that will enable them to live more independently. They work to help with understanding your basic rights, to help facilitate access to services and to explore various eligibility criteria.

HASL also works within the community to make changes that promote full inclusion in all areas of society. They were involved in the changes made to Forks State Park for accessibility. If you are in need of

information regarding disability and/or non-disability related services, HASL can assist. They partner with other organizations and agencies, and can make referrals if necessary.

HASL loans out wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches, bath aids and more to those in need. The Work Incentive Network assists in learning how federal and state benefit programs may be affected by earned income from employment. They also do accessibility consultations, on-site evaluations and ADA design ideas. Other services are also available. They served almost 14,000 people in the 2015/2016 fiscal year. 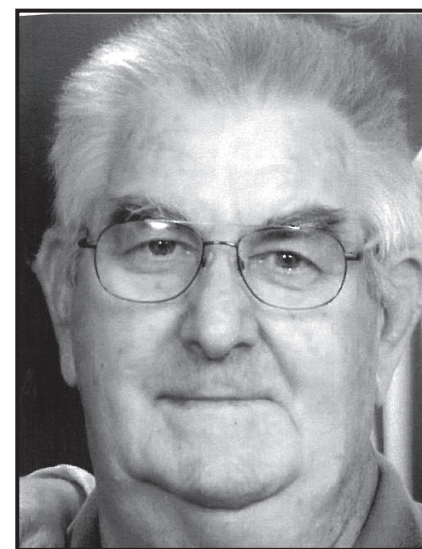
