

# Tales from the Rural Patrol

## Monday, May 22

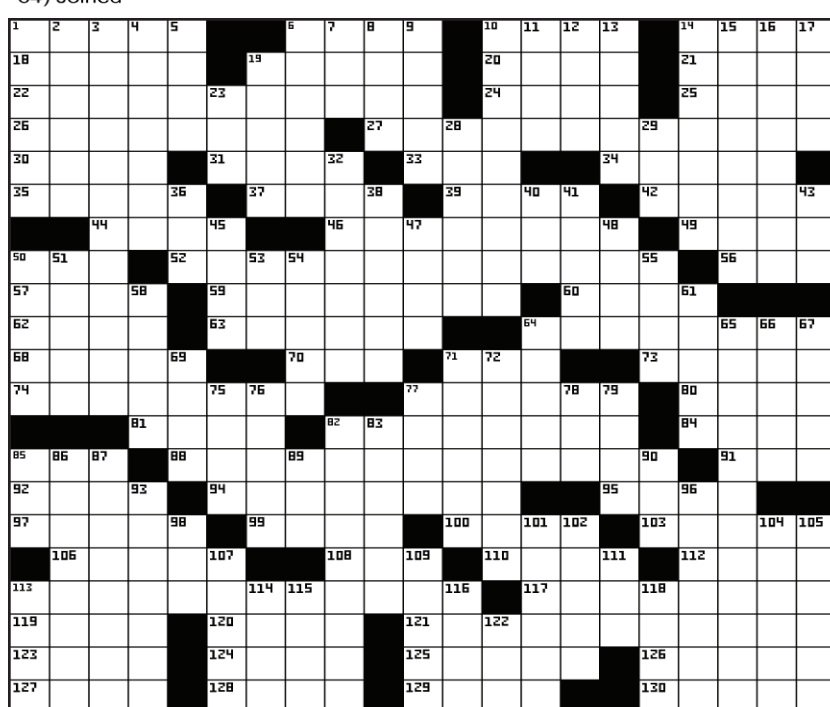
