

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Wednesday, July 19

*A tool box and bicycle were reported as stolen from Chateau at Oregon Caves at 9:28 a.m.

*Surveillance video will be reviewed for clues to a break-in at 213 S. Redwood Hwy. Two windows and the door to a cake case were broken. A report was filed for burglary, criminal mischief, and third-degree theft, and a possible suspect was named.

*Law enforcement apprehended a man in the 200 block of Dogwood Lane at 1:36 p.m. Anthony Kirkman, 35, was cited and released to appear at Josephine County Circuit Court, and a report was filed for failure to register as a sex offender.

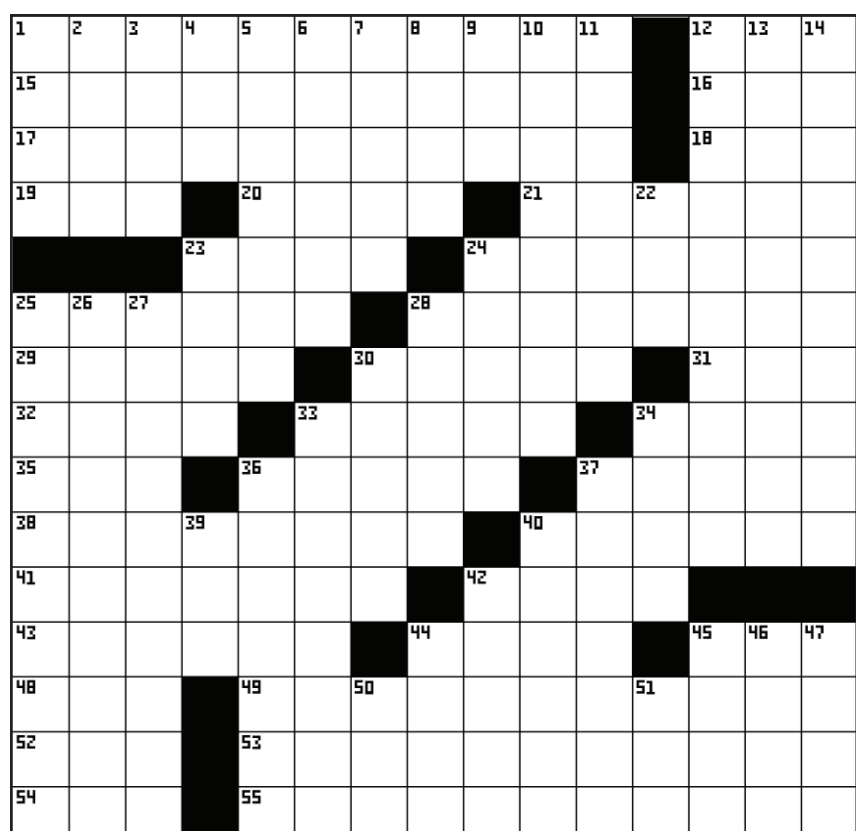
