

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Monday, August 7

*At 9:52 a.m. a gal reported that a motorcycle mysteriously appeared on her property in the 23000 block of Redwood Hwy. Law enforcement checked the serial number, but it did not appear to be stolen.

*Joseph Francis Roselle, 23, was taken into custody at 11:54 a.m. in the 600 block of Lakeshore Drive on a misdemeanor warrant for parole violation detainer. Roselle was detained at Josephine County Jail for failure to appear for driving with a suspended/revoked license.

*There was a domestic violence incident at 3:20 p.m. at 24542 Redwood Hwy. A gal was on top of a guy, hitting him with a stick, according to witnesses. The shirtless guy had what appeared to be rug burns all over his back when he rode away on a bike.
