

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Sunday, Oct. 1

*A visitor from China was strictly warned regarding speed limits near Kerby High Pines Trailer Park at 11:20 a.m.

*At 12:06 p.m. near Jubilee Park, a deputy from Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) contacted an individual with warrants from Grants Pass Dept. of Public Safety. Eric Paul Hanshaw Sr., 42, was charged with failure to appear for second-degree trespass, attempting to commit a Class A misdemeanor, and third-degree theft. When the weather turns cold, it can bring a chill into our homes. Portable space heaters have become a popular way to supplement central heating or heat one room. If you plan to use portable electric space heaters, make sure to follow these tips and recommendations:

HEATER CHECKLIST

- ◆ Purchase a heater that is listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- ◆ Keep the heater at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn, including people.
- ◆ Choose a heater with a thermostat and overheat protection.
- ◆ Place the heater on a solid surface.
- ◆ Make sure your heater has an auto shut-off to turn the heater off if it tips over.
- ◆ Keep space heaters out of the way of foot traffic. Never block an exit.
- ◆ Keep children away from the space heater.
- ◆ Plug the heater directly into the wall outlet. Never use an extension cord.
- ◆ Space heaters should be turned off and unplugged when you leave the room or go to bed.

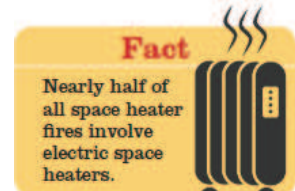
Types of electric space heaters

Oil or water-filled radiator
Heated oil or water travels through the heater.

Fan-forced heater
A fan blows warm air over metal coils.

Ceramic heater
Air is warmed over a ceramic heating element

Infrared heaters
Heat is created by infrared bulbs.



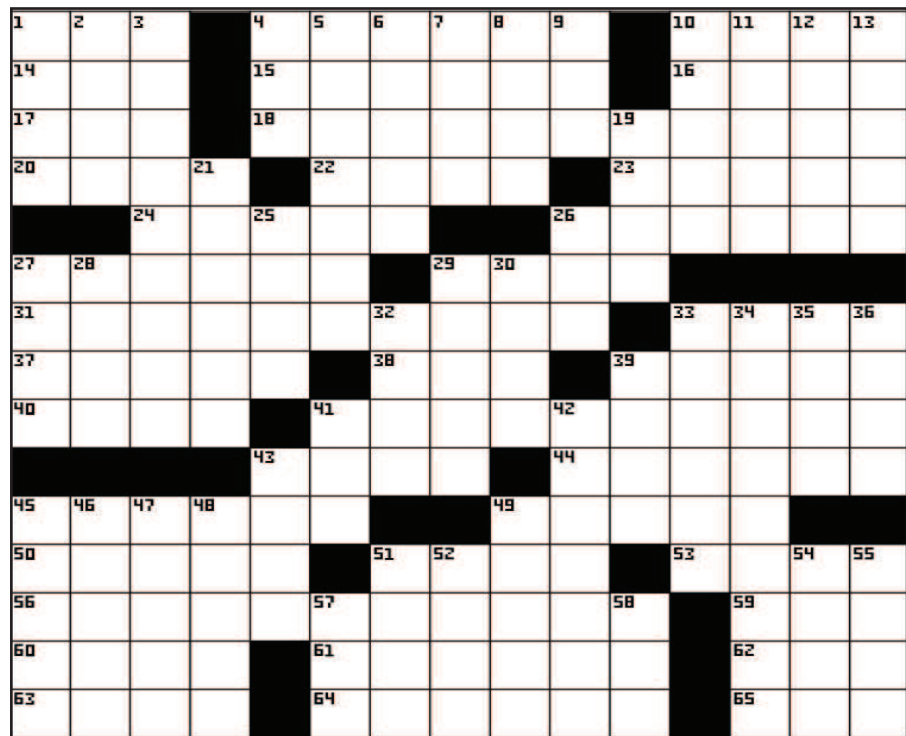
