

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Monday, Oct. 30

- Death

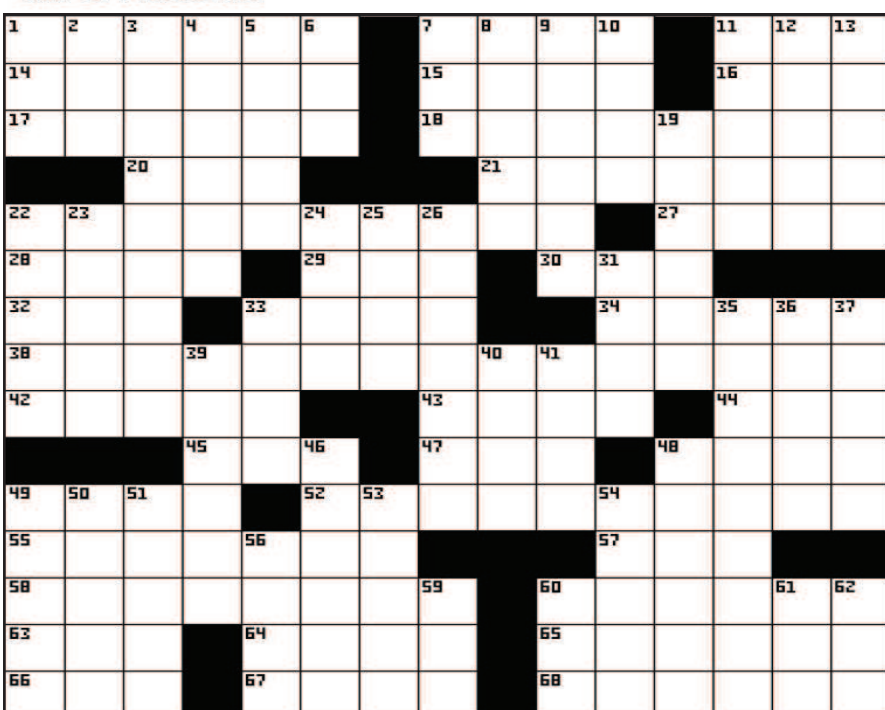
