

# Tales from the Rural Patrol

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## Monday, Jan. 15

\*Josephine County Sheriff's Office (JCSO) checked on a vehicle that was abandoned in the 5000 block of Laurel Avenue. The vehicle was not stolen, so the property owner will be responsible for the tow bill. (Where are car thieves when you need them?)

\*Neighbors in the 400 block of Queen of Bronze Road reported that the cannon was not fired at all while a resident was gone for 10 days. He was welcomed home with seven cannon shots between 9:25-9:48 a.m. (Awww, feel the love.)

\*Two gals in the 1000 block of Hays Cut Off Road were threatening each other over an internet dish. Since lethal force is not legal for defending property, an alternate solution was to obtain a return

box and mail the dish to the internet company.

## Tuesday, Jan. 16

\*JCSO captured two fugitives near Jubilee Park shortly after 4 p.m. Cody Lee Weaver, 27, had a felony warrant from Jackson County Sheriff's Office for failure to appear for unauthorized use of a vehicle. He also had a felony no-bail supervisory authority warrant from JCSO for parole violation for selling marijuana. Jesse Justin Tyme McGivern, 25, was wanted by Grants Pass Department of Public Safety (GPDPS) for failure to appear for identity theft and computer crimes. He also faced charges of third-degree theft from JCSO. Weaver and McGivern were detained in Josephine County Jail.

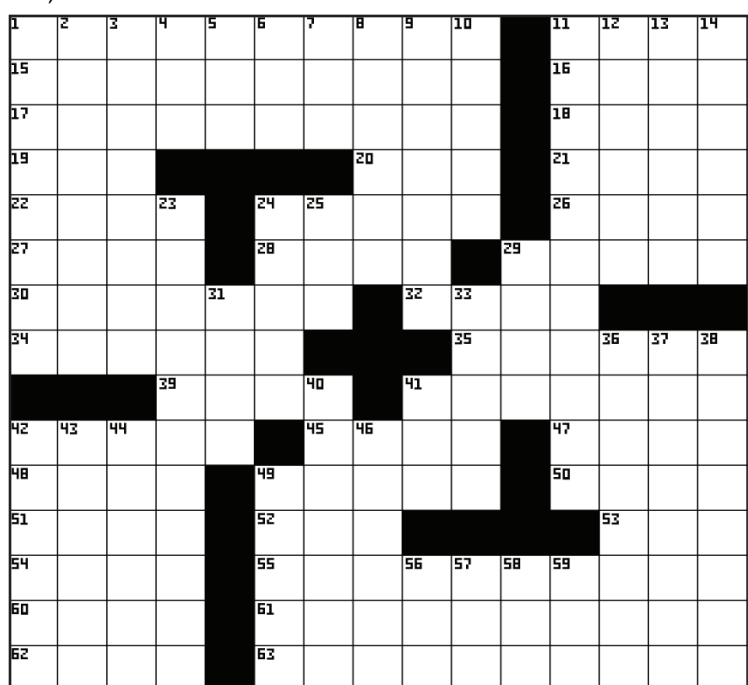
