

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Monday, Feb. 26

*Trusting souls parked a van in the Deer Creek Grange parking lot Feb. 20, but they never returned. The license plates had been removed, and vultures were skulking around the vehicle in the wee hours of the morning. The van was not reported as stolen. (Yet.)
