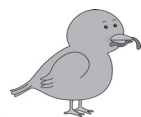
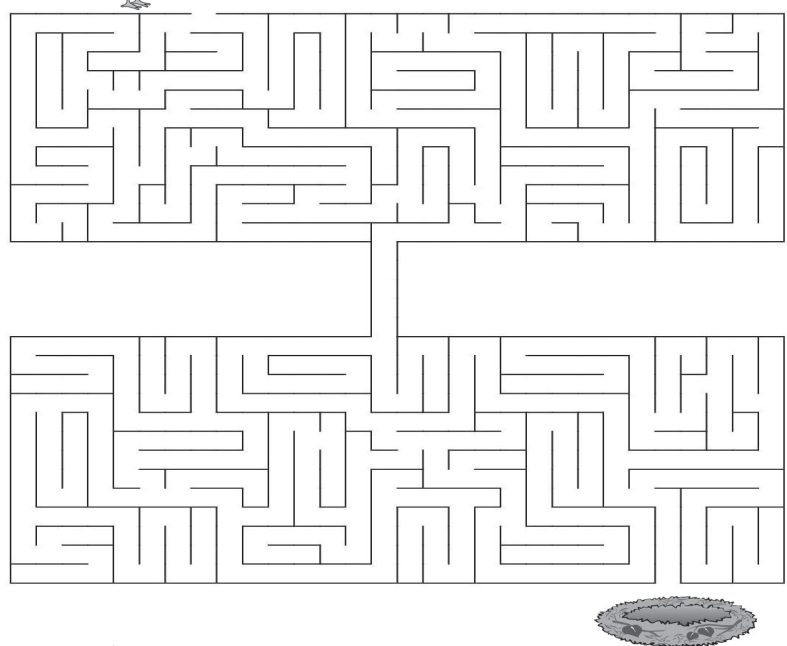


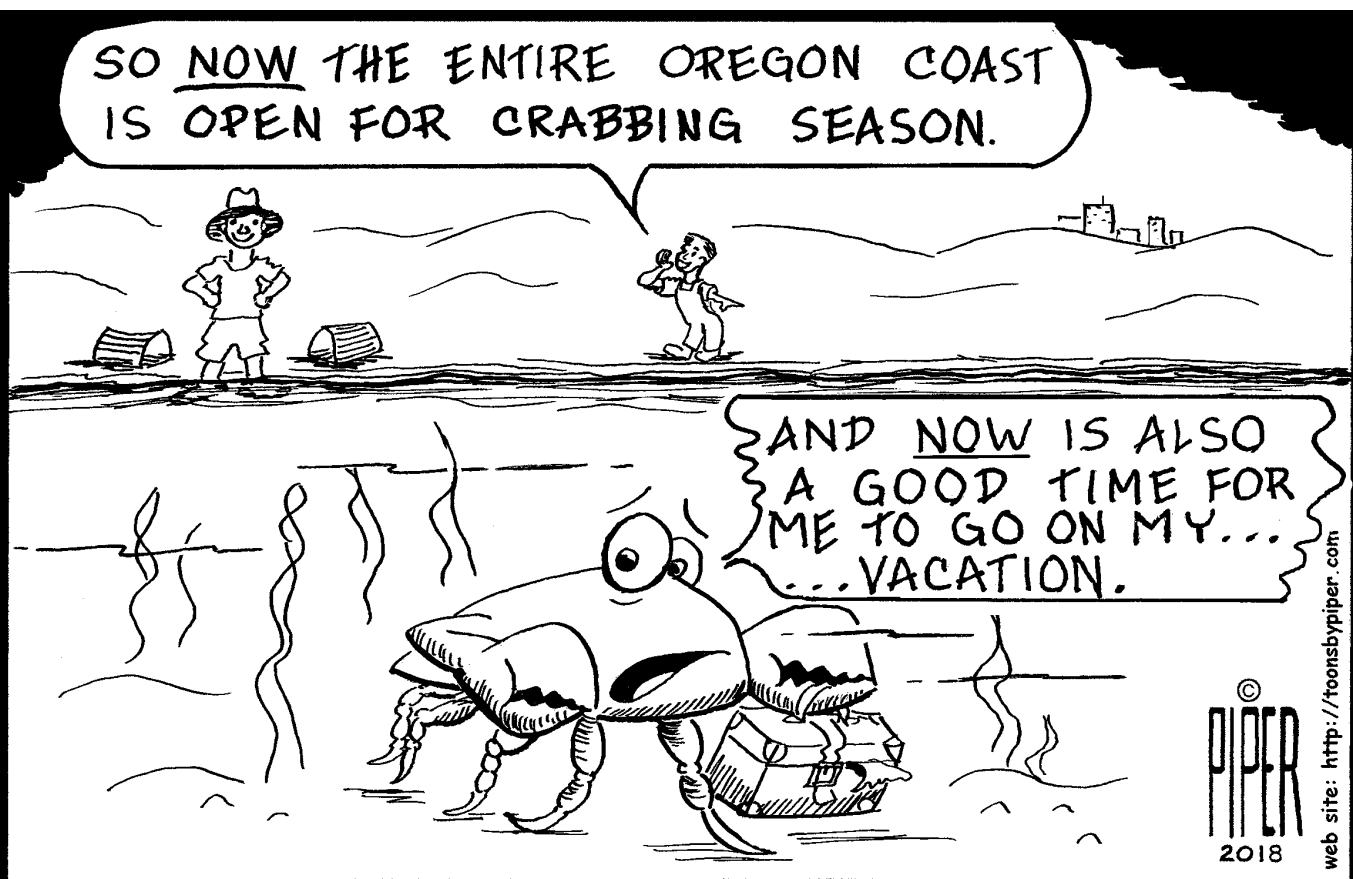
Kidz Maze Mania
