

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Monday, June 11

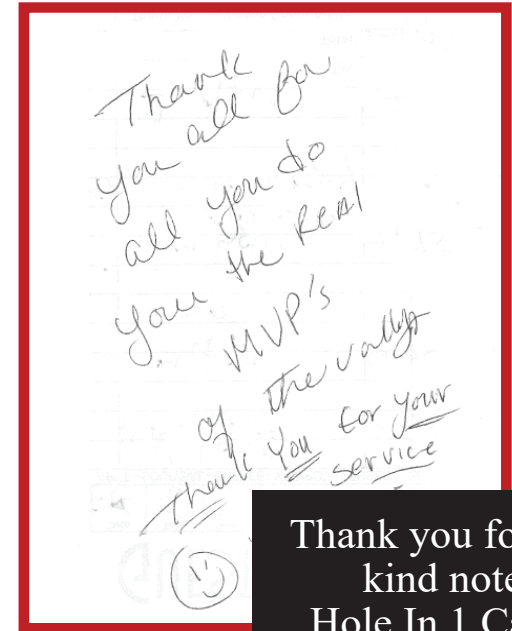
