

Tales from the Rural Patrol

(Editor’s Note: Factual information for ‘Tales’ is provided by official law enforcement agencies. All persons listed are innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. Charges can be amended or dismissed.)

Monday, June 18

*For some unknown reason, a guy in a store in the 200 block of W. Watkins Street was either wearing orange disposable gloves or his hands were painted orange. The color-blind chap was caught red-handed while trespassing June 14 at 4:15 p.m.

*A resident in the 24500 block of Redwood Hwy. was shocked when she discovered her car battery was gone June 10. A neighbor’s video camera caught evidence of the haphazard crook, who left his vice grips behind when he stole the battery. A report was filed for second-degree theft.

*On June 13 a cheapskate tried to pull a dine-and-dash at a restaurant in the 100 block of N. Redwood Hwy. He yelled and threatened employees when his credit card declined. (Like it’s their fault he didn’t pay his Visa bill.)

*Josephine County Sheriff’s Office (JCSO) apprehended two

fugitives in the 1000 block of Holton Creek Road at 1:24 p.m. Matthew James Gordon, 35, was wanted on a felony warrant from Grants Pass Department of Public Safety (GPDPS) for failure to appear for unauthorized use of a vehicle (UUV), felon in possession of a restricted weapon, and possession of a controlled substance-meth (PCS). His partner in crime, Tayah Lynn Delicino, 19, also had a warrant from GPDPS for failure to appear for UUV and PCS-meth. They were both carted off to Josephine County Jail.

*Score bonus points for JCSO for taking another fugitive off the streets. Seth Len Myers, 18, was arrested in the 24500 block of Redwood Hwy. at 3:44 p.m. Myers was detained in JoCo Jail for a laundry list of charges, with felony warrants from GPDPS and JCSO. His charges include probation violation, first and third-degree theft, fourth-degree assault with injury, unauthorized entry into a motor vehicle (UEMV), and criminal mischief. Myers also owes time for failure to report to sanction program.

*An individual with long, dark brown hair was last seen wearing nylons and something red, before locking himself into a bathroom in the 24000 block of Redwood Hwy. at 5:58 p.m.

Tuesday, June 19

*On June 17 a family held a memorial service on their private section of land near Bureau of Land Management property near Rough and Ready Creek. Two motorists hooked their vehicles to the private gate, pulled it open, and broke the lock and chain. The disrespectful drivers were in a small black Toyota-type 4x4 pickup truck and a black, lifted, and modified truck with a large bumper and front winch, but no front plate. When the jerks were confronted, they revved their engines and fired approximately fifty rounds.

Wednesday, June 20

*A man reported the theft of \$5,000 worth of musical and computer equipment from the 100 block of S. Boundary Avenue between May 25 and June 11. *Three dogs were seized at 1 p.m. because one of them killed several chickens in the 3600 block of Rockydale Road.

*A thoughtless fellow sporting a black leather vest and beige baseball hat figured that rolling down the windows of his green Ford Mustang would be enough to cool the black lab panting in his hot car at 11:31 a.m. He then went back into a tavern in the 100 block of S. Redwood Hwy. (Sure is hot outside, need another drink.)

*A woman in the 24500 block of Redwood Hwy. was yelling and throwing rocks at people at 12:20 p.m. She was swinging sticks at children, who ran away from her. Melissa Lowenstein was detained in JoCo Jail for second-degree disorderly conduct and menacing.

*Jessica Artie Clark, 36, was detained in JoCo Jail following her arrest at 1:29 p.m. in the 400 block of W. River Street. Clark had two felony warrants from JCSO, for failure to appear for PCS-meth and second-degree theft.

*Carrie Lynn Thom, 47, was taken into custody near Jubilee Park at 3:56 p.m. for a felony warrant from GPDPS. Thom was charged with failure to appear for PCS-meth and cited to appear in JoCo Circuit Court July 19.

Thursday, June 21

*JCSO received several calls regarding an animal control problem with a pit bull and collie in the 1300 block of Reeves Creek Road. The dogs reportedly destroyed vehicles and chewed on outbuildings, resulting in \$10,000 in damages. The canines allegedly damaged a Corvette, Toyota 4x4, Ford Mustang Mach 1, Dodge pickup truck, Jeep Wagoneer, and a Caterpillar tractor when they chased ground squirrels. Friday, June 22

*A visitor from Washington had been drinking, and was having difficulties walking across Deer Creek Road at 11:01 a.m. He assured deputies that he would find a safer spot to sleep it off. He was warned for disorderly conduct.
