

Tales from the Rural Patrol

Monday, August 6

*A touchy fellow in the 4300 block of Lakeshore Drive was upset because his co-workers were taunting him. On Aug. 2 another employee tapped his shoulder, so he wanted to file a battery charge. He was extremely rude and belligerent when contacted by Josephine County Sheriff Office (JCSO), and he stated that his pain scale was a zero. (So is he.)
*JCSO assisted during a wildland fire in the 2200 block of Laurel Road from 1:27 p.m. until 3:19 p.m. (Many thanks to all that helped fight the fires.)

Tuesday, August 7

*The owner of Funky Kitchen put a parking lot behind his business in the 100 block of S. Redwood Hwy. Between July 31 and Aug. 7, people were camping and sleeping there. He will be filing a trespass letter. (Pave paradise, put in a new campground.)

*Three partiers at Rough and Ready Creek were issued a federal citation for underage drinking and possession of a controlled substance (PCS) - marijuana at 4:24 p.m.

Wednesday, August 8

*At 9:34 a.m., a concerned citizen was worried about a couple with a

history of heavy meth use, who were on the run from the law in Tennessee. A short woman with long blonde hair and blue eyes had not been heard from since she moved out of the 300 block of N. Hussey July 22. A neighbor said she may have entered a rehab in Medford, which was good news for the fretful friend.

*Burglars used bolt cutters to break into property in the 1400 block of Crooks Creek Road between Aug. 1-3. They vandalized the home and took generators and miscellaneous items. A welfare card was found near where the chain was cut. A report was filed for second-degree burglary and first-degree theft.

*Robert Heatlie, 38, was arrested near Hogue Meadows at 2:30 p.m. Heatlie was detained in Josephine County Jail for probation detainer.

*A fellow said he just moved to Cave Junction in July, so he was living in his camper, with his belongings in his car. On Aug. 2 his car was in a parking lot near Washington Federal and Diggin’ Livin’. When he returned, his MacBook, \$50 golf balls, JBL Charge three speakers, and his Armani and Versace suits were missing. (Armani suits and he’s living out of his camper?)

*Katherine Denae Rodriguez, 20, was arrested near Hays Cutoff at 4:58 p.m. Rodriguez was detained in JoCo Jail for a JCSO felony warrant for failure to appear for elude.

Thursday, August 9

Saturday, August 11
